Main results

- The **annual change** of the CPI for the month of January increases three tenths and stands at **3.3%**.
- The **annual change** of **core** inflation is **1.6%**, one tenth greater than in December.
- The **monthly change** of the overall index is **-0.7%**.
- The **Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices¹ (HICP) annual change** stands at **3.0%**, one tenth higher than the previous month.

Annual evolution of consumer prices

The annual change for the overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) in January was 3.3%, three tenths higher than that registered in December. This change coincided with the HICP flash estimate, published last 31 January.

The groups which most contributed to this increase in the annual change were:

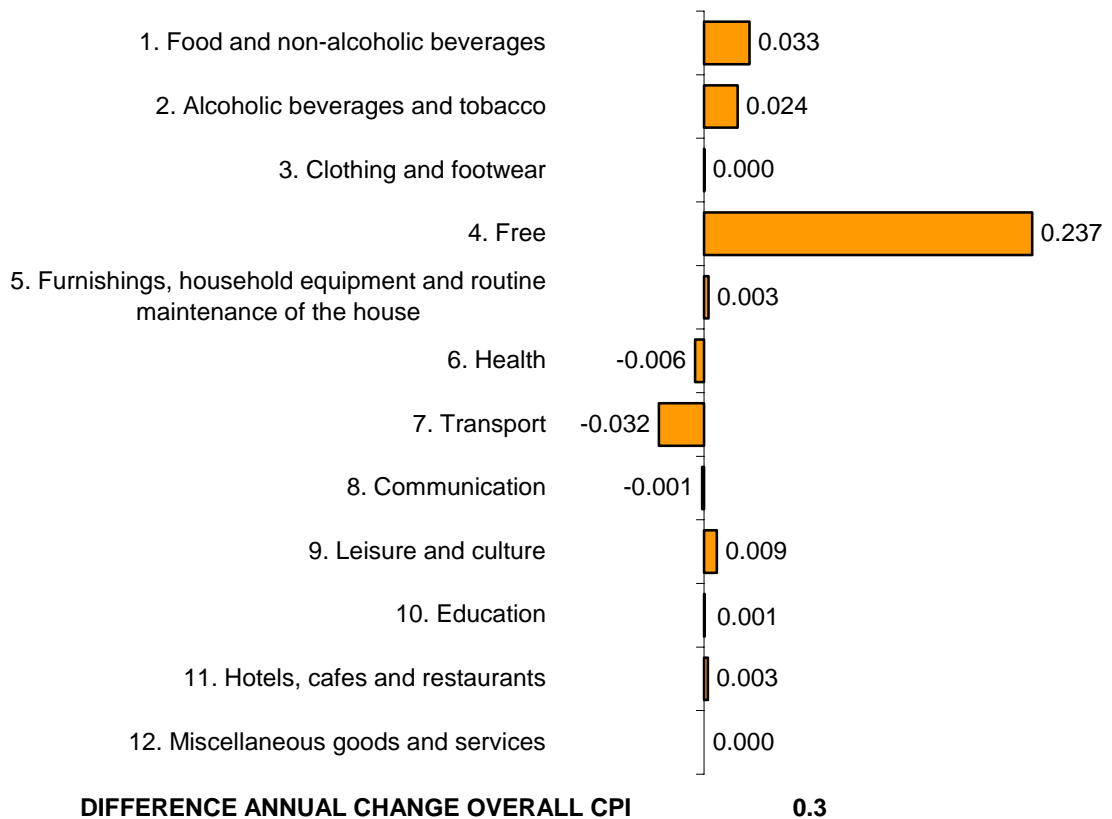
- **Housing**, whose annual change rose more than two points, reaching **7.8%**, the greatest change since September 2008. This increase was largely explained by the rise in price of *electricity* in January 2011, whose annual change stood at 15.0%, the highest since January 2002.
- **Food and non-alcoholic beverages**, with a change of **0.9%**, two tenths higher than the previous month. The divisions which most stood out due to their contribution to this change were *mineral waters, soft drinks and juices* and *sugar*.
- **Alcoholic beverages and tobacco**, whose annual change rose nine tenths, standing at **16.1%**, due to the fact that the rise in price of *tobacco* was greater than in January last year.

In addition to the aforementioned increases, the decrease in the annual change of the following group stood out:

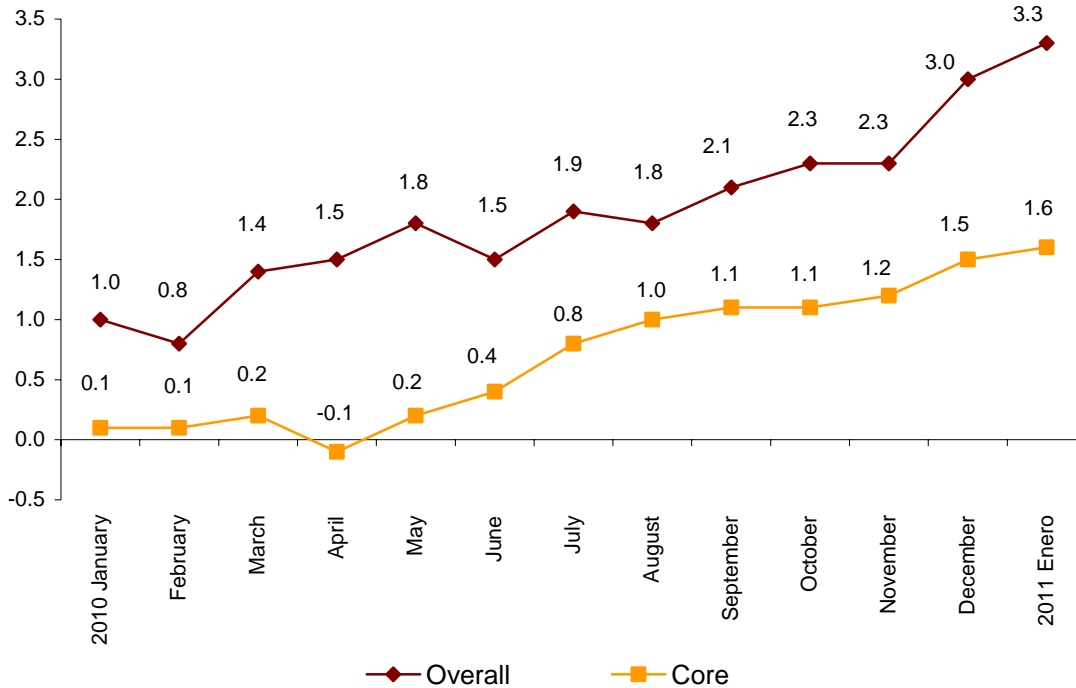
- **Transport**, with a change of **9,0%**, two tenths lower than last month. This decrease in the change was due to the fact that the rise in prices of *fuels and lubricants for personal transport equipment* was lower than in January 2010.

The annual change of **core inflation** (overall index without unprocessed food or energy products) increased one tenth to **1.6%**, and its difference from the overall index change stood at more than one-and-a-half points.

Annual evolution of consumer prices

In January, the monthly change of the overall CPI was **-0.7%**.

The groups with the greatest positive monthly contribution to the overall index were the following:

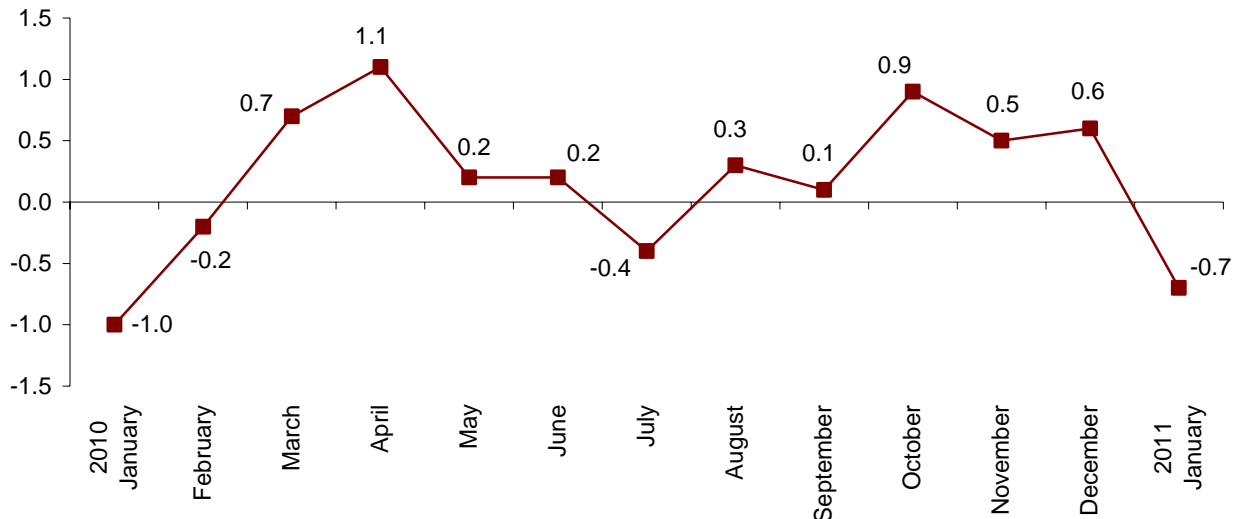
- **Housing**, whose monthly change of **2.8%** was due to the increase in the prices of *electricity* and, to a lesser extent, *gas, heating fuels* and *water distribution*. Its contribution to the overall index was **0.328**.
- **Transport**, whose change of **1.4%** contributed **0.214**. This change was largely explained by the rise in prices of *fuels and lubricants for personal transport equipment*.
- **Alcoholic beverages and tobacco**, with a monthly change of **2.1%** and a contribution of **0.061** to the overall index, mainly due to the change in prices of *tobacco*.
- **Miscellaneous goods and services**, with a change of **0.6%**, largely due to the rise in prices of *insurance*, which is normal at the beginning of the year. Its contribution to the overall index was **0.053**.

Likewise, the groups with the greatest negative monthly contribution in the month of January were the following:

- **Clothing and footwear**, with a monthly change of **-14.2%** and a contribution of **-1.222**, which accounted for the contribution of the winter sales.
- **Recreation and culture**, with a change of **-1.8%**, which contributed **-0.139** to the overall index, mainly due to the change in the price of *package holidays*.

• **Furnishings, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house**, whose change of **-0.9%** reflected the price decreases that are customary in the month of January. Its monthly contribution was **-0.059**.

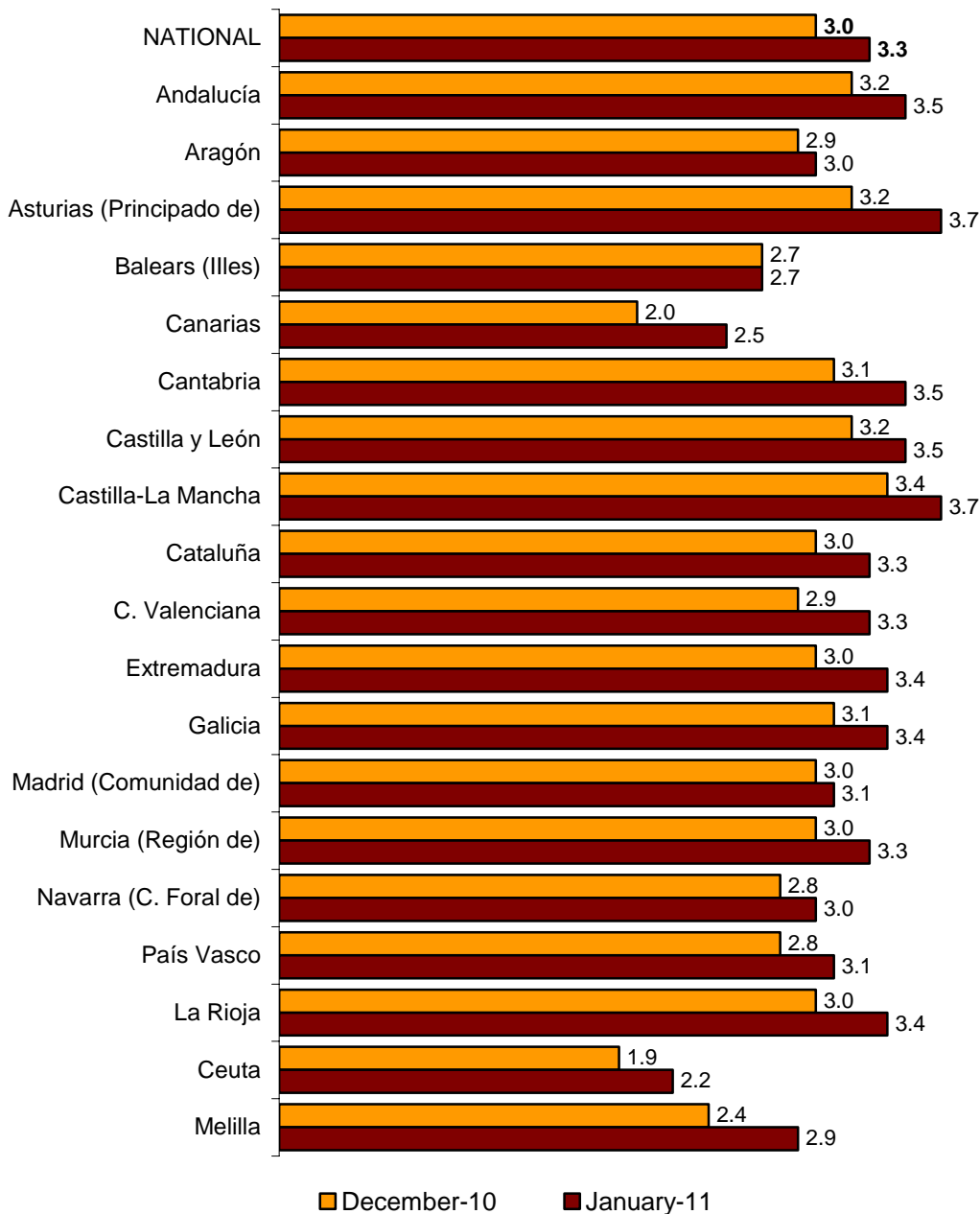
Results by Autonomous Community. Annual changes

The greatest increase in annual change corresponded to the Autonomous Communities of Principado de Asturias (3.7%) and Canarias (2.5%), which increased their change by five tenths.

In turn, the annual change for Illes Balears remained at 2.7%.

Index by Autonomous Community and autonomous city

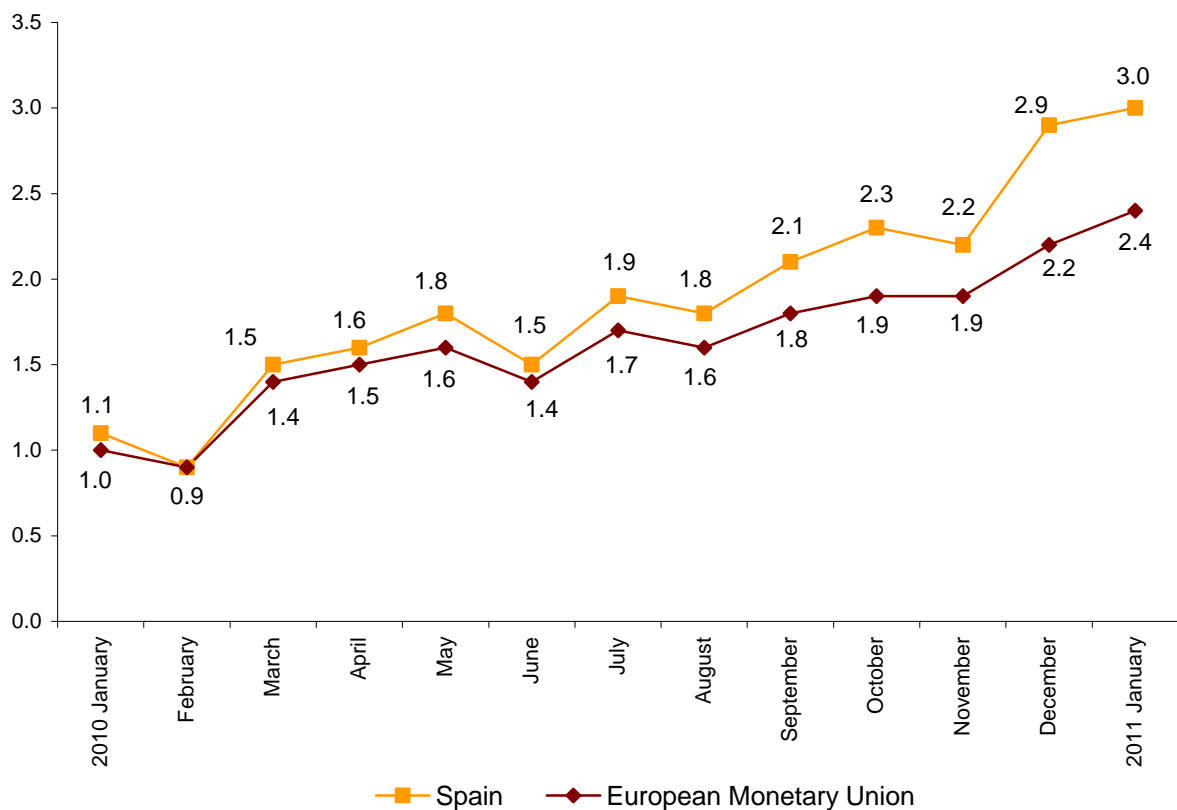


Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP)

In January, the annual change of the HICP increased one tenth, standing at **3.0%**. This change coincided with the HICP flash estimate, published on 31 January.

The monthly change of the HICP was **-1.3%**.

In turn, the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices at Constant Taxes (HICP-CT) registered in **December** 2010 an annual change of **1.7%**, more than one point below that recorded by the HICP in said month (**2.9%**). The difference between the two indicators increased one tenth as compared with that recorded in November, due to the special taxes levied on tobacco.

The monthly change of the HICP-CT was **0.5%**.

Informative annex

Updated weightings, CPI 2006 base

The National Statistics Institute has carried out the annual update of the weightings used to compute the Consumer Price Index (CPI), in accordance with the CPI System, 2006 base.

The CPI, 2006 base, is distinguished by its dynamism and ability to adapt to changes in consumer behaviour, via the analysis of the evolution of expenditure. With this objective, an in-depth study is carried out of the changes noted in the market.

As a result of this study, the CPI weighting structure was updated in 2011. The information used for the update is taken from the Household Budget Survey (HBS) and from other sources. In this way, the CPI reflects the changes in habits of consumers occurring in the last year.

The changes entered do not affect continuity of the CPI series, 2006 base, since the computation formula of the 2006 System consists of chain-linking the indices, so that no break occurs. Therefore, the weighting update does not affect the published changes.

The following table shows the weightings used during 2010 and those which will be used during 2011 to compute the overall CPI and that of the following groups:

Updated HICP weightings

Likewise, weightings used to compute the HICP have also been updated, to adapt it to the changes in consumer behaviour.

New methodological treatment of the HICP

The Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) is an indicator whose objective is to measure the evolution of consumer prices using the harmonised methodology of the European Union. Its importance therefore lies in the high degree of comparability between EU countries, which increases as the harmonisation process, begun in the year 1995, advances.

The new treatment that will be applied in the HICP, in order to take a step further in this process, refers to the methodology used for seasonal articles. Its main characteristics are contained in an EU Regulation¹ that makes its application compulsory in all countries.

Characteristics of the new methodology

The Regulation considers seasonal articles to be those that are no longer available for sale during certain periods of the year, and this situation repeats itself cyclically. The Spanish HICP considers *fresh fruit, fresh vegetables and clothing and footwear* to be seasonal items.

The fact that the item is not available on the market makes it impossible to follow the price thereof that had been collected during the months when it was available. This makes it necessary to apply methods enabling continuity of the price series and to calculate the indices in the time period in which the product is unavailable.

The methodology that the EU Regulation proposes is based on the estimate of the price in the months in which the seasonal product is not found on the market. This estimate is carried out using the evolution of the prices of those products, in the same category, that are found on the market.

The new methodology implies a significant change, with regard to that which has been applied up until now, and therefore, the implementation of the Regulation as of January 2011 will have the following two consequences: it will bring about a **change in the evolution of HICP**, since the price changes of the affected divisions will have a profile with **much sharper increases and decreases**, due to the fact that prices not collected are estimated, something which was not previously done in the HICP; it will cause a **break in the HICP series**, because the indices calculated using the new methodology are not in keeping with those published in previous years.

In order to avoid a break in the series, data published in 2010 for this indicator has been revised by applying this new methodology, in accordance with the recommendations of the European regulations. Therefore, the annual changes published in 2011 are homogeneous, since they are calculated with this revised data. Change in consumption classification

As of January 2011, in order to adapt the classification of HICP products to the international consumption classification COICOP/HICP, *Real rents of other dwellings*, hitherto in division 11.2. *Accommodation services*, come to form part of 04.1. *Gross housing rents*.

The revised series for the year 2010 incorporates this change in classification in order for annual changes not to be affected.
