Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) September 2018

The annual change in the flash estimate of the CPI stands at 2.2% in September, the same registered in August


The annual rate of the flash estimate of the HICP is 2.2%

According to the flash estimate issued by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in September 2018 was 2.2%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply a maintenance in the annual rate, since in August this change was 2.2%.

This behavior highlights the increase in the prices of electricity. It also influences the prices of food and non-alcoholic beverages, remains stable compared to the increase experienced in September 2017.

Annual Evolution of the CPI, base 2016 (1) Overall Index





In turn, the annual variation of the flash estimate of the HICP in September stands at 2.2%. If confirmed, the annual rate of the HICP would maintained with respect to the previous month.

Monthly rate performance

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registered a variation of 0.2% in September, as compared with August.

Evolution of the monthly rate of CPI in September



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in September stood at 0.6%1.

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¹ Due to the methodological differences between the CPI and the HICP in the treatment of the clothing and footwear group, in the months of seasonal change a discrepancy in the monthly variation of both indices can occur.
