#### **Passenger Transport Statistics (PT)**

July 2018. Provisional data

The number of public transport passengers increases by 3.4% in July, as compared with the same month of the previous year


# City transport increases by 3.3% in the annual rate and inter-city transport by 2.9%

#### **Evolution of passenger transport**

More than 376.7 million passengers used public transport in July, 3.4% more than in the same month of 2017.

City transport increased by 3.3% in the annual rate and inter-city transport did so by 2.9%. Within the latter, it is worth noting the 7.9% increase in air transport.

#### **Evolution of the monthly rate**

The variation rate of the number of public transport passengers in July as compared with June was -12.1%. In order to contribute to the analysis and interpretation of data, the evolution of the monthly rate of public transport passengers in recent years is shown in the following chart.

## **Evolution of the monthly rate of public transport passengers** (monthly variation for July over June)




#### **City transport**

City transport was used by more than 234.2 million passengers in July, 3.3% more than in the same month of 2017.

Subway transport increased by 6.7% and grew in all the cities. Palma's subway presented the largest increase (38.3%).

Among the cities with subway, the greatest increase in bus transport was registered in Bilbao (5.7%), and the only decrease was registered in Madrid (-8.3%).

## City transport passengers in cities with subways July 2018. Annual rate




City transport by bus increased by 1.0% in July, as compared with the same month of the previous year.

The number of passengers in bus transport registered the greatest increases in Galicia (6.8%), Andalucía (6.2%) and Canarias (5.4%).

In turn, bus transport passengers decreased in Comunidad de Madrid (-6.8%), Extremadura (-4.8%) and Castilla–La Mancha (-2.9%).

#### Inter-city transport


More than 114.7 million passengers used inter-city transport in July, representing a 2.9% increase as compared with the same month of 2017.

By type of transport, air transport increased by 7.9%, rail transport by 3.6% and bus transport by 2.0%. Maritime transport did not change.

Local distance passengers increased by 3.4% for bus transport and by 3.7% for rail transport. Regional distance passengers decreased by 0.4% for bus transport and increased by 3.0% for rail transport.

Finally, long distance passengers decreased by 5.0% for bus transport and increased by 3.8% for rail transport. Within the latter, AVE (high speed railway) increased by 5.1%.

#### Special and unscheduled transport

More than 27.7 million passengers used special and unscheduled transport in July, indicating an increase of 6.2% in the annual rate.

The number of special transport passengers increased 1.9%, reaching more than 7.5 million users. Within this, school transport increased by 0.5%, and work transport did so by 2.0%.

In turn, unscheduled transport increased 7.9%, as compared with the same month of 2017, reaching more than 20.1 million passengers.
