# Passenger Transport Statistics (PT)

October 2011. Provisional data

#### Main results

- The number of passengers using city transport increases 0.2% in October 2011, as compared with the same month the previous year.

- The number of passengers using inter-city transport increases 0.9% in the interannual rate.


- Special and unscheduled transport registers a decrease of 6.1%, as compared with the same month the previous year.

#### **Evolution of passenger transport**

Nearly 426.4 million passengers used public transport in October 2011, that is, 0.4% less than in the same month the previous year.

The average rate of the total passengers grown 0.4% for the first ten months in 2011 as compared with the previous year. By type of transport, all types presented positive average rates during this period, except special and unscheduled transport, which registered a decrease of 3.5%.

#### City transport. National results and by Autonomous Community



City transport was used by more than 260.5 million passengers in October, 0.2% more than in the same month the previous year.

Metropolitan transport increased 0.2% in the interannual rate. The metropolitans of Sevilla, Madrid and Barcelona registered increases of 4.7%, 0.6% and 0.3%, respectively. Conversely, the metropolitans of Palma, Valencia and Bilbao registered negative rates of -6.8%, -2.5% and -1.0, respectively.

The city transport by bus increased 0.2% in the interannual rate, with more than 155 million passengers in October.

By Autonomous Communities, the highest increase were registered in País Vasco (5.5%) and Galicia (4.0%). Conversely, the highest decrease were registered in Región de Murcia (-2.0%), Comunidad de Madrid (-1.4%) and Andalucía (-1.3%).



#### Annual rates and number of passangers average Urban transport by road


#### Inter-city transport

Mora than 116 million passengers used inter-city transport in October 2011, indicating an interannual increase of 0.9%.

**Rail** transport increased 3.1% and **Sea** transport increased 1.2%. Conversely, **Air** transport decreased 6.3% and **road** (coach) transport decreased 0.5% in the interannual rate.

Local transport increased 3.3% in rail transport and decreased 1.2% in passenger transport by bus. Regional transport increased in both transport (1.7% in rail transport, and 1.0% in bus transport). Meanwhile, long-distance increased 1.3% in rail transport, and decreased 1.4% in road (coach) transport.

#### Special and unscheduled transport

More than 49.6 million passengers used special and unscheduled transport in October, indicating a decrease of 6.1% in the interannual rate.

Special transport passengers decreased 8.2%, reaching more than 34 million. Within this, work transport decreased 5.7% and school transport decreased 8.9%.

In turn, unscheduled transport decreased 1.0%, as compared with the same month the previous year, exceeding 15 million passengers.
