# Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) March 2017

## The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at 2.3% in March, seven tenths lower than that registered in February


## The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is 2.1%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in March 2017 is 2.3%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply a decrease of seven tenths in its annual rate, given that in February this change was 3.0%.

This decrease is mainly explained by the decrease in the prices of *fuels* (diesel and gasoline/petrol), compared to the increase of prices of 2016 and the decrease in the prices of *electricity*.

## Annual evolution of the CPI, base 2016 (1) Overall Index





In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in March stands at 2.1%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would decrease nine tenths as compared to the previous month.

### **Evolution of the monthly change**

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices register a 0.0% variation in March, as compared to the month of February.

#### **Evolution of the monthly change of the CPI in March**



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in March stands at 1.1% 1.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Due to the methodological differences between the CPI and the HCPI in the processing of the group wearing clothes and shoes, in the months of seasonal change a discrepancy in the monthly variation of both indices may occur.
