# Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) April 2014


## The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at 0.4% in April, five tenths over that registered in March

### The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is 0.3%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in April 2014 was 0.4%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply an increase of five tenths in its annual change, given that in March this change was –0.1%.

It is worth mentioning in this behaviour the increase in the prices of *Touristic services* due to the Easter holidays. This increase in the CPI is also due to the stability in the prices of *Electricity* and *Fuel and lubricants*, whose prices decreased in 2013.




In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in April stood at 0.3%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would have increased five tenths as compared to the previous month.

#### **Evolution of the monthly change**

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registered a 0.9% increase in April, as compared with the month of March.

#### Evolution of the monthly change of the CPI in April



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in April stood at 0.6%.
