Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) April 2016


The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at -1.1% in April, three tenths lower than that registered in March

The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is –1.2%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in April 2016 is -1.1%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply a decrease of three tenths in its annual rate, given that in March this change was -0.8%.

This decrease is mainly explained by the decrease in the prices of *Package holidays* and *electricity*.

⁽¹⁾ The last data refers to the flash estimate


In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in April stands at -1.2%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would decrease two tenths as compared to the previous month.

Evolution of the monthly change of the CPI in April

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices registers a 0.7% variation in April, as compared to the month of March.



In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in April stands at 0.4%.
