Flash estimate of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) October 2016


The annual change of the flash estimate of the CPI stands at 0.7% in October, five tenths higher than that registered in September

The annual change of the HICP flash estimate is 0.5%

According to the flash estimate published by the INE, the annual inflation of the CPI in October 2016 is 0.7%.

This indicator provides a preview of the CPI that, if confirmed, would imply an increase of five tenths in its annual rate, given that in September this change was 0.2%.

This increase is mainly explained by the increase in the prices of electricity and fuels (diesel and gasoline/petrol), compared to the decrease of prices of 2015.





In turn, the annual change of the HICP flash estimate in October stands at 0.5%. If confirmed, the annual change of the HICP would increase five tenths as compared to the previous month.



Evolution of the monthly change

According to the flash estimate of the CPI, consumer prices register a 1.1% variation in October, as compared to the month of September.

In turn, the monthly change of the HICP flash estimate in October stands at 0.8%.
