Industrial Production Index (IPI). Base 2005¹ September 2013. *Provisional data*

The annual variation of the Industrial Production Index stands at 3.5% in September, as compared with -4.2 % in August

The adjusted for calendar effect annual rate of the IPI stands at 1.4%, as compared with -2.1% in August

Annual evolution of industrial production

The Industrial Production Index (IPI) registered an annual rate of 3.5% in September, over seven and a half points above that registered in August.

All the industrial sectors by economic destination of the goods registered positive annual variations, except Energy. Those with a greater positive effect were:

- Capital goods, with an annual variation of 8.4%, registered the greatest positive effect, of 1.577. Most of the activities within this sector registered an increase in their production. Among these activities, it is worth highlighting due to its influence, *Manufacture of structural metal products, Manufacture of special-purpose machinery,* and *Manufacture of parts and accessories for motor vehicles.* In turn, *Manufacture of agricultural and forestry machinery* registered the greatest negative effect.
- **Non-durable consumer goods**, with a rate of 5.3% and an effect of 1.558. More than a half of the activities comprising this sector registered an increase in their production. The activities that registered the greatest positive effect were *Processing and preserving of fruit and vegetables* and *Manufacture of other food products*. Among the activities that registered a decrease in their production, highlighting, *Printing and service activities related to printing*.
- Intermediate goods, with a rate of 1.5% and an effect of 0.505, due to the increase in the production of most of the activities comprising this sector. Among them, highlighting *Manufacture* of other chemical products. In turn, *Manufacture* of cutlery, tools and general hardware is the activity with the greatest negative effect of the sector.

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¹ From the reference month October 2013, which according to the calendar of short-term statistics of the INE will be disseminated the 5th December 2013, the IPI will start to be published with Base 2010. Thus, the INE complies with Regulation no. 1165/98 from the Council on short-term statistics, which establishes that the indices must change their base every 5 years, in the years ending with 0 and 5, and that all indices must be adjusted to the new base year in three years as of the end of the new base year previously mentioned.

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that most affected the annual rate of IPI in the month of September 2013.

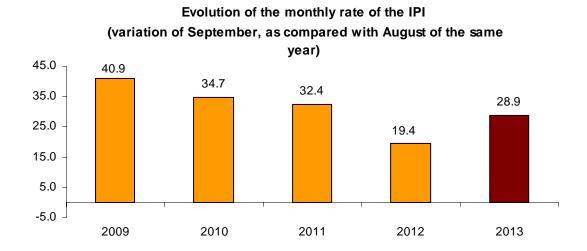

Monthly rate evolution²

The variation rate of IPI in September as compared with August 2013 was 28.9%. This rate is nine points and a half over that registered in September 2012.



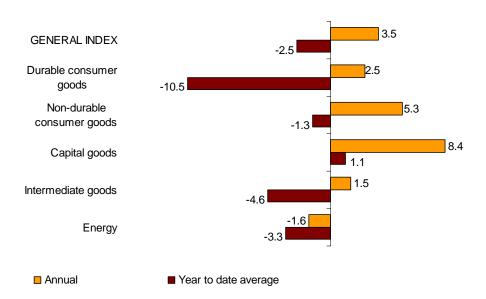
² In order to contribute to the analysis and interpretation of data, it has been added in this section the performance of the monthly IPI rate in September in the last years. The monthly rates of this type of series may have a seasonal behavior; therefore it is advisable to evaluate it in relation to the item of data for the same month in previous years.

Year to date average rates

The average of the Industrial Production Index registered a variation of **-2.5%**, in the period comprehending January to September 2013, as compared with the same period of the previous year.

By economic destination of the goods this rate was only positive (1.1%) in the Capital goods sector.

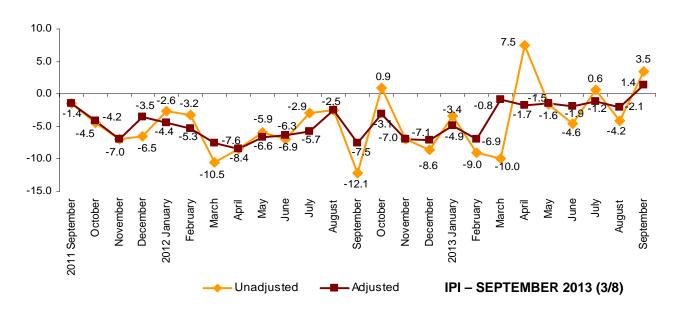
Annual and average rates of the IPI General index and by economic destination



Evolution of the IPI, adjusted for the calendar effect

After adjusting the calendar effect, that is, the difference between the number of working days in a given month in different years, the annual variation of the IPI in the month of September was 1.4%, three points and a half over that registered in August.

Annual evolution of the IPI General index adjusted and unadjusted

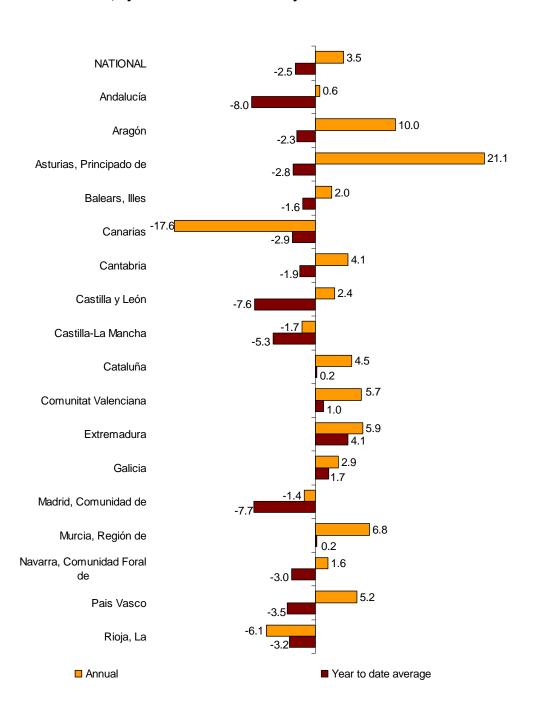


Results by Autonomous Community. Variation rates

In September, 13 Autonomous Communities registered a positive annual rate in the industrial production. The greatest increases were registered in Principado de Asturias (21.1%), Aragón (10.0%) and Región de Murcia (6.8%).

In turn, the Autonomous Communities with the greatest decreases in their annual rate were Canarias (-17.6%), Le Rioja (-6.1%) and Castilla-La Mancha (-1.7%).
