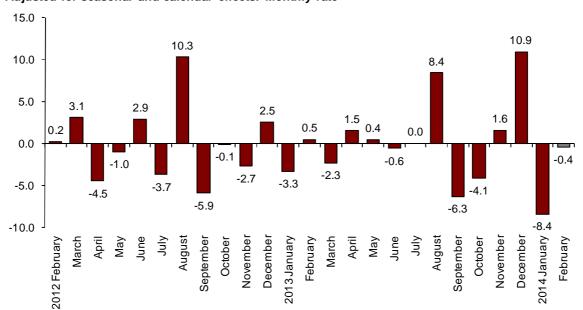
Industrial New Orders Received Indices (INORI). Base 2010 February 2014. Provisional data

The monthly variation of the General Industrial New Orders Received Index stands at –0.4% in the series adjusted for the seasonal and calendar effects

The annual rate stands at -1.0% in both the series adjusted for the seasonal and calendar effects and the original series

Monthly evolution of New Orders Received

The monthly variation of the Industrial New Orders Received Index (INORI) between February and January 2014 stood at –0.4%, after adjusting for the seasonal and calendar effects. This rate was eight points higher than that registered in January.

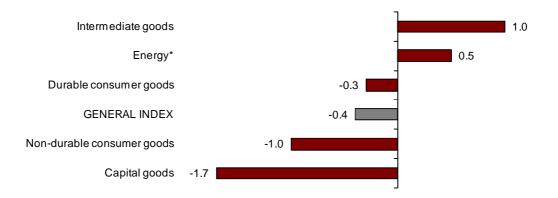


New Orders Received General Index Adjusted for seasonal and calendar effects. Monthly rate



By economic destination of the goods, the value of Capital goods (-1.7%), Non-durable consumer goods (-1.0%) and Durable goods (-0.3%) registered a decrease as compared with the previous month. In turn, Intermediate goods and Energy increased by 1.0% and 0.5%, respectively.

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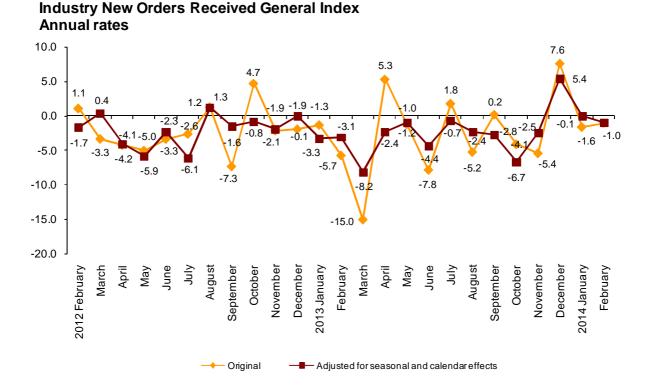
Annual evolution of the New Orders Received

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The Industrial New Orders Received Index (INORI), after adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects, registered a variation of -1.0% in February, as compared with the same month of the previous year; that is, almost one point lower than that registered in January.

The original series of the INORI registered an annual variation of -1.0%, that is, more than half point higher than that registered in the previous month.



By economic destination of the goods, three out of the five sectors analysed registered negative annual rates after adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects. *Energy* (-9.6%) registered the greatest decrease.

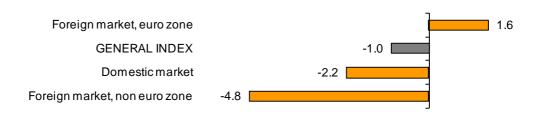

Annual evolution of New Orders Received by destination market. Original series

New orders received decreased in the non euro zone (-4.8%) and in the domestic market (-2.2%), as compared with February 2013. Regarding the foreign market, in the euro zone, they increased by 1.6%.

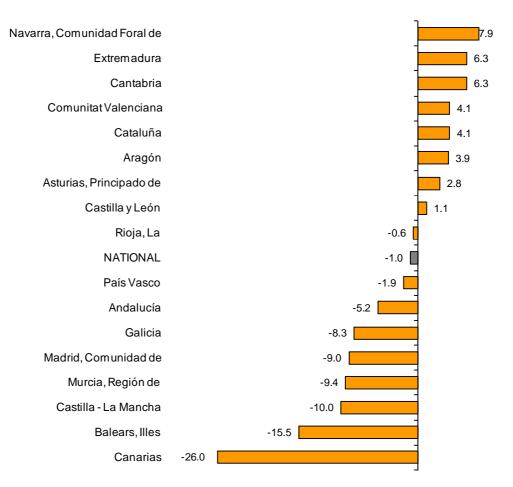
Industrial new orders received indices: General and by market Annual rate



Results by Autonomous Community. Annual variation rate of the New Orders Received. Original series

In February, eight Autonomous Communities registered increases in their New Orders Received and nine Autonomous Communities recorded decreases. The greatest decreases were registered in Canarias (–26.0%) and Illes Balears (–15.5%).
