# Export and Import Price Indices of Industrial Products. Base 2005 July 2011. Provisional data

## Main results

- The **interannual** variation rate of the **IPRIX** for the month of July increases five tenths and stands at 5.2%.
- The **annual** rate of the **IMPRI** is **9.2%**, one-and-a-half points higher than that registered in June.
- The **monthly** variation of export **prices** is **0.3%**.
- The **import** prices **monthly** rate stands at **0.6%**.

#### Annual evolution of export prices of industrial products

The interannual rate for the Export Price Index (IPRIX) for the month of July was **5.2%**, five tenths more than that registered in June.


The activities that most influenced this rise in the annual rate were:

- Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products, whose variation increased more than seven points and stood at 34.1%. This increase was explained by the fact that its prices increased this month, whereas they decreased in July 2010.
- Manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers, whose annual variation was **0.1%**, two tenths higher than last month, due to the fact that it showed a lower decrease in prices this month that was experienced in the same month the previous year.
- *Metallurgy; manufacture of iron, steel and ferro-alloy products*, with an annual rate of **8.9%.** This variation was seven tenths higher than in June, and responds to the increase in prices of this activity in July 2011, as compared with the decrease observed in 2010.

If the analysis is carried out by economic destination of the goods, the industrial sectors that most influenced this rise in the annual rate were *Energy* and *Non-durable consumer goods*.

The interannual rate for *Energy* increased almost seven points, standing at 32.8%, whereas the rate *Non-durable consumer goods* increased four tenths to 3.1%.

### Annual evolution of import prices of industrial products


The monthly variation of the Import Price Index (IPRIM) increased its interannual rate one-and-a-half points in July, standing at **9.2%**.

The divisions that most influenced this rise in the annual rate were:

- Extraction of crude petroleum and natural gas, whose annual variation increased almost five points, reaching 33.8%, the highest value registered since May 2010. This increase was due to the increase in prices for this activity, as compared with the decrease that occurred in the same month the previous year.
- *Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products* whose interannual variation stood at **30.1%**, more than six points higher than last month, due to the increase in prices for this activity, which decreased in July 2010.
- **Food Industry**, whose annual variation increased almost two points, reaching **10.8%**. This increase was due to the increase in prices this month, as compared with the decrease registered last year.

By economic destination of the goods, all industrial sectors have influenced this rise in the annual rate. Among these, worth noting was *Energy* (31.2%) and *Intermediate goods* (8.1%), whose rates increased almost five points and more than one point, respectively.

#### Monthly evolution of export prices of industrial products

The Export Price Index registered a rate of **0.3%**, as compared with June 2011.

By economic destination of the goods, the most relevant industrial sectors that presented a positive effect on the general index were:

- *Energy*, whose monthly variation stood at **2.3%.** Their contribution to the general index was **0.183**.
- Non-durable consumer goods, with a monthly variation of 0.4%, which contributed 0.074.

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that most affected the monthly rate of the IPRIX in the month of July.

#### Monthly evolution of import prices of industrial products

The monthly variation of the Import Price Index in July was 0.6%.

By economic destination of the goods, the industrial sectors that presented the greatest positive monthly effect were:

- *Intermediate goods*, whose monthly variation rate was **0.6%**, and whose contribution to the general index was **0.179**.
- *Non-durable consumer goods*, with a monthly variation of **0.8**%, which contributed **0.130**.
- *Energy*, which contributed **0.122** to the IPRIM, and had a monthly increase of **0.6%**.

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that most affected the monthly rate of the IPRIM in the month of July.


