Housing Price Index (HPI). Base 2007 Third quarter 2014

The annual rate of the HPI stands at 0.3% in the third quarter of 2014


The price of housing rises 0.2% as compared with the previous quarter

Annual evolution of housing prices

The annual rate of the Housing Price Index (HPI) in the third quarter of 2014 decreased five tenths, standing at **0.3%**, which slowed the growth rate in prices of the last two quarters.

By type of housing, the annual variation of **new housing** stood at **0.8%**, more than one point over that registered in the previous quarter.

In turn, the annual rate for second-hand housing decreased one tenth, reaching 0.1%.




Annual evolution of the HPI General index, new housing and second-hand housing



Quarterly Housing Price Evolution


The general HPI variation in the second quarter 2014 was 0.2%.



Evolution of the quarterly rate of the HPI in the last two years

By type of housing, new housing prices increased by **1.2%** by considering together the second and the third quarter 2014. In turn, second-hand housing prices stood unvaried as compared with the previous quarter.

Results by Autonomous Community. Annual variation rates


The annual rate decreased in 12 Autonomous Communities in the third quarter 2014.

The greatest decreases in the annual variation were recorded in Galicia (down 2.1 points, reaching –2.0%), and La Rioja (down 1.8 points, reaching –3.5%).

The greatest increases in this variation were registered in Principado de Asturias (up 0.5 points, reaching -1.5%), Región de Murcia (which did so by 0.3 points, standing at 1.5%), and Aragón (increased 0.3 points, reaching -2.0%).

Annual rates of the HPI, base 2007


General index by Autonomous Communities and cities



Results by Autonomous Community. Quarterly variation rates

The quarterly variation of the HPI was negative in 9 Autonomous Communities in the third quarter 2014. The greatest decreases were registered in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (-2.3%) and Extremadura (-2.2%).

In turn, Illes Balears (2.1%) and Cantabria (1.7%) were the Communities the greatest positive quarterly rates.
