

General Elections of 20 November 2011

35,776,615 voters will be eligible to vote in the general elections to be held on 20 November

The electoral census may be consulted from 3 to 10 October

35,776,615 voters will be eligible to vote in the General Elections this coming 20 November 2011. Of this figure, a total of **1,519,397 voters will participate for the first time in general elections**, having turned 18 since the previous General Elections held on 9 March 2008.

Meanwhile, 6,233,350 voters will be eligible to vote in the elections to the Parliament of Andalucía.

Spaniards registered in the electoral census of absent residents living abroad should submit their application to vote to the Provincial Delegation of the Electoral Census Office that corresponds to their registration, by 22 October, using the official form sent out to their residential postal addresses by said Office, and available from consulates.

The electoral census may be consulted from 3 to 10 October in municipal councils and in provincial delegations of the Electoral Census Office. Voters residing abroad may check their registration data during this same period in the different consulates.

Queries may be made electronically, once the interested party has provided identification, or through the physical posting of the voting lists if said electronic means are not available.

Voter complaints

The **complaints period**, if any error or omission is detected, **will take place from 3 to 10 October, when the Electoral Census will be posted**. Complaints shall be presented at municipal councils, consulates or provincial delegations of the Electoral Census Office.

Census cards

The Electoral Census Office shall issue all voters resident in Spain a census card, containing the corresponding polling station, as well as the voting premises and address, as of 24 October.

Voter Query Processing

The provincial delegations of the Electoral Census Office shall respond to queries regarding activities under their jurisdiction (census registration, postal vote, voting premises, census cards etc.) at their offices as well as over the telephone, by calling **901101900**.

Online Queries

The National Statistics Institute web site (<http://www.ine.es>) has information available on the electoral census, containing data of interest for this enquiry, current census, complaints, postal voting, deadlines, legal regulations, and figures for registered persons.

All voters may consult polling station and voting premises data.

Furthermore, voters holding a digital certificate published by the Electronic Headquarters of the National Statistics Institute, may, at the time of their enquiry, obtain details of their registration with the electoral census and of the polling station and electoral premises at which they should vote.
