### Employment of Persons with Disabilities<sup>1</sup>

Use of the Economically Active Population Survey and the State Database of Persons with Disabilities. Year 2013

### Main results

- According to the State Database of Persons with Disabilities, 1,428,300 persons aged 16 to 64 years old and resident in family households certify disabilities in 2012. This figure represents 4.7% of the Spanish population of working age.

-37.4% of persons with legally recognised disabilities are economically active in 2012. This economic activity rate is almost 40 points lower than that of the population without disabilities.

- The unemployment rate for the group is 35.0% in 2013, nine points higher than that of the population without disabilities.

- The employment rate of persons with certified disabilities stands at 24.3%. Out of the total employed persons, 88.4% are wage earners and, among them, 79.2% have a permanent contract.

- 26.6% of employed persons with disabilities working in ordinary centres has some deduction in their Social Security contributions, and the same percentage has a specific disability contract.

Employment of Persons with Disabilities uses the information derived from an integration of the statistical data provided by the Economically Active Population Survey (EAPS) with the administrative data registered in the State Database of Persons with Disabilities (BEPD). It also includes data regarding measures for encouraging employment from the General Social Security Treasury (TGSS), information regarding the receipt of benefits from the Register of Public Social Benefits of the National Social Security Institute (INSS), and data regarding dependency from the System for the Autonomy and Support for Dependent Persons (SAAD).

All results refer to the population aged 16 to 64 years old.

Results were calculated following the new Population and Dwelling Census 2011 base. The results corresponding to the 2009-2012 period were reviewed in order to add them to that base.

### Characteristics of the economically active population with disabilities

In 2013, there were a total of 1,428,300 persons of working age (16 to 64 years old) with certified disabilities, accounting for 4.7% of the total population of working age.

The following sections in this press release analyse the labour situation of those persons with disabilities who participate in the labour market (economically active), comparing this with the rest of the population. Given that this comparison may influence personal characteristics other than the disabilities, we first provide an overview of the said characteristics of economically active persons, with and without disabilities.

Among the economically active population with disabilities, a higher percentage of men was observed, as well as greater weight of the group aged 45 to 64 years old, and less representation of those persons with higher education, than in the economically active population without disabilities. The latter could cause a difference in the labour situation, especially in the unemployment rate, between the two populations.

#### Economically active persons aged 16 to 64 by disability . Year 2013. Absolute values in thousands


For economically active persons similar characteristics were observed regarding sex, age and educational level as compared with those recorded for the economically active persons without disabilities. The distribution according to the seniority in the job post of the employed persons with disabilities was very similar to that accounted for by the remaining employed persons, with the only difference of the percentage of employed persons in the "three years and over" bracket of seniority in the job being slightly higher, and the percentage being slightly lower in the rest of brackets.

Regarding the branches of activity, employed persons with disabilities had more representation in the following branches: *Health and social services activities, Administrative and support services activities, Public Administration and Defence, compulsory Social Security.*


Regarding unemployment, among population with disabilities there is a greater percentage of men, of persons aged 45 to 64 and of unemployed persons with primary education, as compared to unemployed persons without disabilities. Conversely, there was a lesser representation of unemployed persons with higher education.

### Disability and labour market: activity, employment and unemployment rates

The most significant aspect for the group of persons with disabilities was their low degree of participation in the labour market. In 2013, there were 533,600 economically active persons and an activity rate of 37.4%, almost 40 points lower than that of the population without disabilities (77.2%). This rate scarcely increased since 2009.


The number of employed persons with disabilities in 2013 was 346,600. The employment rate was 24.3%, more than 32 points lower than that registered for persons without disabilities. Since 2009, the employment rate has decreased, showing a trend similar to that experienced by population without disabilities.

In turn, the number of unemployed persons with disabilities reached 187,000. The unemployment rate for this group exceeded that of the population without disabilities by nine points (35.0% against 26.0%). The evolution since 2009 showed an increase in said rate, which was higher than that registered in the unemployment rate of persons without disabilities.

### Disability and labour market, by sex

In 2013, there were 202,400 employed men with disabilities (58.4% of the total employed persons with disabilities), as compared to 144,200 women (41.6%).



#### Persons with disabilities, by sex and economic activity situation

As with the general population, women with certified disabilities showed a lesser economically active presence in the labour market. Nonetheless, their economic activity rate was closer to that of male than among the population without disabilities (34.3%, as compared to 39.9%).

The employment rate of the men with certified disabilities exceeded that of the women with disabilities by 3.8 points. For the remaining population aged 16 to 64 years old, the difference was 9.6 points.

In turn, the unemployment rate of women with certified disabilities in 2013 (35.3%) was higher than that of men (34.9%). For women without disabilities, this rate was also higher. The difference between the unemployment rates of men and women were slight in both population groups.


The evolution of the employment rates was negative, as compared with the year 2012, for women with disabilities (0.5 points lower), and it remained the same for men. In both cases, this evolution was higher than that of population without disabilities (0.8 points less for women and 1.1 points less for men).

In turn, unemployment rates increased for both men (1.4 points higher than that of 2012) and women (2.5 points higher) with disabilities. Unemployment increased to a greater extent in both men and women with disabilities, as compared to the rest.

### Disability and labour market, by age

Age exerted a considerable influence on the participation gap existing in the labour market between the population of persons with disabilities and the remaining population, observed in the greater incidence of unemployment of the younger population, and the greater incidence of economic inactivity of the older age group.

As compared to 2012, it was worth noting the drop in economic activity and in the employment of young persons with disabilities (3.4 and 2.5 points less, respectively). Unemployment increased to a lesser extent in the 25-44 years old group of persons with disabilities, as compared to the rest of the population. In the older people group, both employment and economic activity increased, as well as unemployment.



### Disability and labour market, by type of disability

Labour participation was strongly determined by the type and intensity of the disability. In 2013, the economic activity rate associated with the lowest intensity degree of disability (lower than 45%) stood at 54.8%. As the intensity of disability increased, the economic activity rate decreased to 14.1%.


As compared to 2012, the activity of all groups with a disability degree increased, except for the 65%-74% group. The greatest increase was recorded by the group with the lowest disability intensity.





Thus, persons with auditory impairments presented the highest economic activity rates (59.5%). At the opposite end of the spectrum, the *intellectual* impairment registered the lowest rates (27.5%).

Regarding the evolution of the activity as compared to 2012, worth noting were the increases in the activity rates of the groups associated to auditory impairments, of the digestive, metabolic and endocrine systems and mental disorders. The decrease in the activity was worth noting in the groups of disabilities associated to impairments of the osteoarticular system and of the cardiovascular, immune and respiratory systems.



(\*) The "Others" impairment group includes persons with expression, undetermined and unknown disabilities, and as of 2011, also includes persons affiliated with Social Security and for whom the type of disability is not recorded. Therefore, it is not compatible with the years prior to 2011


### **Employment and disability**

Most workers with disabilities were wage earners, had a permanent contract, full time employment and they carried out their activity in the Services sector.

Thus, 88.4% of persons with disabilities who worked in 2013 did so as wage earners (6.1 points higher than for persons without disabilities), and 79.2% of them had a permanent contract (2.4 points higher than for the population without disabilities).

82.3% of employed persons with disabilities worked full time (2.4 points lower than for persons without disabilities).

81% of employed persons with disabilities carried out their activity in the Services sector, as compared to 75.8% of those without disabilities.

### Measures encouraging participation in the ordinary labour market<sup>2</sup>

Among the policies intended to encourage the labour activity of the group, are those that favour their incorporation into ordinary employment. Worth noting among them are the reductions and discounts in the contribution quotas, both for wage-earning workers and for self-employed workers, and in the case of wage-earning workers, the specific hiring modality for workers with disabilities, which in addition to including discounts in the Social Security contribution quotas, considers certain subsidies.

In 2013, **26.6% of employed persons with disabilities** who made Social Security contributions **had some sort of deduction in the contributions**.


# Conversely, **26.6% of wage earners with disabilities had the specific disability contract modality**.

Deductions in the contribution quotas and specific hiring mostly benefited the male population, the group aged 16 to 44 years old, the disability group associated with intellectual impairments and the persons with a greater disability degree between 65% and 74%.

### Disability and economic activity protection

Public Social Benefits are pensions and subsidies paid out of public funds, and whose purpose is to cover disability situations, retirement, death and survival, family protection, unemployment for persons aged over 52 years old, and other regulatory improvements and supplementary benefits. Therefore, they represent an important support tool for disability situations.

11 out of 100 persons of working age received a benefit in the year 2013. In the specific case of persons with disabilities, the public benefit system benefited 822,600 persons (57 out of 100). Out of the total persons with disabilities, 21.7% of them (178,800 persons) were economically active.

79.2% of the persons with disabilities who received benefits (651,500) received the benefit due to a labour disability. In turn, 2.8% (23,000) of the persons with disabilities who received a benefit did so solely in non-contributory terms, that is, without having contributed previously in exchange for them.

Another protection measure for those persons with disabilities is the recognition of the Dependency Situation, following the passing of *Law 39/2006, of 14<sup>th</sup> December, on the Promotion of Personal Autonomy and Assistance for persons in a dependency situation.* 

In 2013, a total of **17.4% of persons with disabilities** (248,500) **also had the dependency situation officially recognised.** Out of them, 17,200 (6.9% of dependent persons with disabilities) remained economically active.


### Disability and economic activity, by Autonomous Community

The Autonomous Communities that recorded the highest economic activity rates among the group of persons with disabilities in 2013 were the Autonomous Cities of Ceuta and Melilla (46.3%) and the Autonomous Communities of Región de Murcia (46.0%), Illes Balears (45%) and Comunidad de Madrid (43.2%).

In turn, the lowest economic activity rates were registered in Galicia (30.5%), Canarias (30.6%) and La Rioja (31.1%).

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### Methodological note

The Employment of Persons with Disabilities (EPD) statistics have been prepared using the Economically Active Population Survey (EAPS) of the INE and the State Database of Persons with Disabilities (BEPD) of the Institute for the Elderly and Social Services (IMSERSO). Its creation was made possible by the initiative of these two bodies and of the Directorate General for Disability Support Policies, of the Spanish Committee of Representatives of Persons with Disabilities (CERMI) and of the ONCE Foundation. Up to 2012, it has been partially financed by the latter organisation within the framework of the Operational Programme for Fighting Discrimination 2007-2013 and the Talent Programme, jointly financed by the European Social Fund.

The Employment of Persons with Disabilities researches the labour market-related situation of those aged 16 to 64 years old who have a disability certificate (with a degree of disability recognised by the responsible assessment bodies as greater than or equal to 33%).

The project came into being as a pilot trial in 2010, with data referring to the year 2008. Subsequently, data was included regarding the measures encouraging employment and regarding protected employment from the General Social Security Treasury (TGSS), as well as in formation regarding the receipt of benefits from the Register of Public Social Benefits of the National Social Security Institute (INSS) and data regarding dependence from the System for the Autonomy of and Support for Dependent Persons (SAAD).
