**General Elections of 26 June 2016**

**36,518,100 voters will be eligible to vote in the general elections**

**Voters residing abroad who wish to vote have to submit their application to vote before 28 May**

**The electoral census may be consulted from 9 to 16 May**

36,518,100 voters will be eligible to vote in the General Elections this coming 26 June 2016. Of this figure, 34,597,844 are residing in Spain and 1,920,256 are residing abroad.

**Application to vote of voters residing abroad**

Voters residing abroad who wish to vote should submit their application to vote to the Provincial Delegation of the Electoral Census Office that corresponds to their registration, by 28 May. The Electoral Census Office has sent out the official application form to all eligible voters.

**Applications may be made electronically.** In order to do this, an electronic certificate from the INE Electronic Office is needed, or the password sent with the official form.

The form is also available in consulates and web pages of the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation and the Electoral Census Office.

**Voters complaints**

The electoral census may be consulted from 9 to 16 May in municipal councils and provincial delegations of the Electoral Census Office. Voters residing abroad may check their registration data during this same period in the different consulates.

Voters may present their complaints at municipal councils, consulates or provincial delegations of the Electoral Census Office, during this same period, from 9 to 16 May.

**Census cards**

The Electoral Census Office shall issue all voters resident in Spain a census card, containing the corresponding polling station, as well as the voting premises and address, as of 30 May.

## Voter Query Porcessing

The INE web site (<http://www.ine.es/en/welcome.shtml>) has information available on the electoral census, containing data of interest about the Electoral Census Office activity during these elections, current census, complaints, postal voting, deadlines and legal regulations.

The INE Electronic Office <https://sedeine.gob.es> also has a **registration data consultation service** in the elctoral census, as well as the **polling station and electoral premises** at which they should vote, once the voter has provided identification with an electronic certification (electronic ID, among other).

Furthermore, there is a **general consultation service about polling stations and electoral premises** in the Electronic Office with no identification needed.
