

Strong rise in international passengers in 2022

The number of passengers using public transport in 2022 reached 4,369.2 million, increasing by 28.8% compared to 2021, according to the Passenger Transport Statistic. More than half (60.45%) occurred within cities.

The number of inter-city transport passengers rose by 33.8%. Most of the passengers used the bus (52.3%) and a total of 43.6 used the railway, a ratio that is similar to last year's.

Most increases when compared to 2021 were registered in international maritime and air transport: 328.0% more maritime passengers and 138.3% more air plane passengers.

In 2021, Spain led within the EU, with the higher number of passengers transported by air plane.
