### Passenger Transport Statistics (PT)

January 2012. Provisional data

#### Main results

- The number of passengers using **city transport increases 1.8%** in January 2012, as compared with the same month the previous year.


- The number of passengers using inter-city transport increases 1.3% in the interannual rate.

– Special and unscheduled transport increases a 0.6%, as compared with the same month the previous year.

#### **Passengers transport evolution**

More than 390.7 million passengers used public transport in January, 1.8% more than the same month the previous year.

City — Inter-city — Special and unscheduled


#### City transport. National results and by Autonomous Community

City transport was used by more than 246 million passengers in January, 1.3% more than the same month of the previous year.

Metropolitan transport increased 0.9% in its interannual rate. The metropolitans of Bilbao, Madrid and Valencia registered positive interannual rates of 2.4%, 1.6% and 0.7% respectively.

City transport by bus increased 1.5% in the interannual rate, with more than 145.2 million passengers in January.

All the Autonomous Community registered positive rates in January, except Aragon (-2.4%) and Andalucia (-0.3%). The higher interannual rates increases were Region de Murcia (14.8%), Galicia (5.5%) and País Vasco (4.8%).




# Annual rates and number of passangers average Urban transport by road

#### Inter-city transport

More than 104.1 million passengers used inter-city transport in January, indicating an interannual increase of 3.4%.

All types of transport registered increases in January, except air transport that registered a decrease of 7.4%. **Sea** transport registered an increase of 12.1%, **road** transport (coach) an increase of 4.8% and **rail** transport increase 2.4%.

Local distance passengers increased 5.7% for bus transport, and 2.0% for rail transport. Regional passengers distance increased 10.6% for rail transport and 3.0% for bus transport. Finally, long-distance passengers increased 0.5% in rail transport and 0.4% in road transport.

#### Special and unscheduled transport

More than 40.6 million passengers used special and unscheduled transport in January, indicating an increase of 0.6% in the interannual rate.

Special transport passengers increased 0.9%, reaching nearly 31 million. Within this, both school and work transport increased 0.9%.

In turn, unscheduled transport decreased 0.5%, as compared with the same month the previous year, exceeding 9.6 million passengers.
