## Passenger Transport Statistics

June 2010. *Provisional data*

### Main results

- The number of passengers using **city transport** decreases 1.6% in June 2010, as compared with the same month the previous year.
- The number of **passengers using inter-city transport** decreases 2.6% in the interannual rate.
- **Special and unscheduled transport** registers a 3.9% decrease as compared with the same month the previous year.

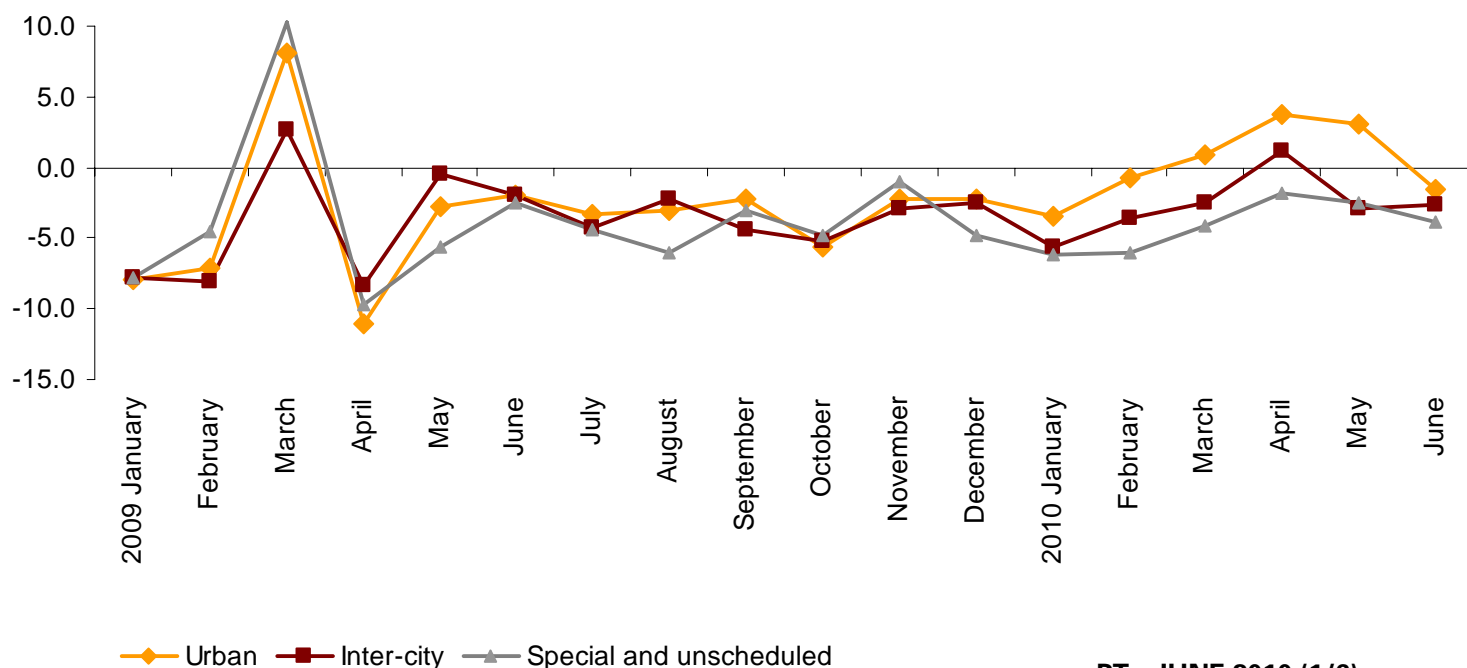
### Evolution of passenger transport

**More than 414 million passengers** used public transport in June 2010, that is, 2.2% less than in June 2009.

The average rate of the total passengers stood at  $-1.0\%$  for the first six months of the year. By type of transport, all types presented negative average rates during this period, except city transport, which recorded a rise of  $0.3\%$ .

#### Kind of transports

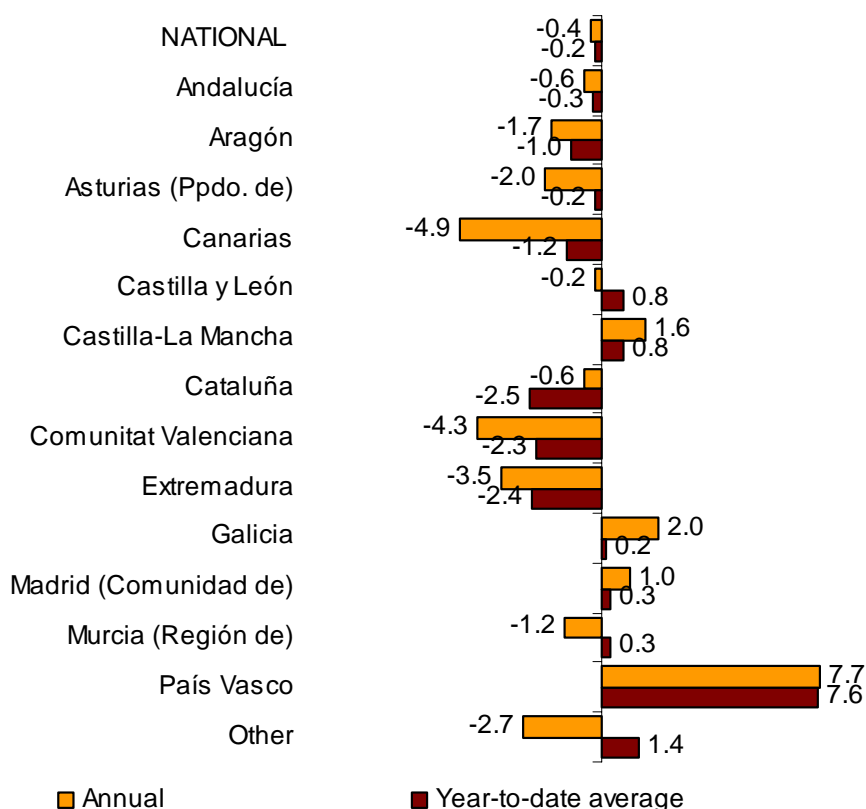


## City transport. National results and by Autonomous Community

City transport was used by nearly 251 million passengers in June 2010, that is, 1.6% less than in the same month the previous year. Within this, metropolitan transport registered an interannual rate of -3.5%. All of the capitals with a metropolitan registered interannual increases in the month of June, except Madrid that registered an interannual increase of 11.3%, due to, in part, the strike caused by metropolitan city transport employers. Worth noting was the increase registered by the Sevilla metropolitan (90.1%), as it was inaugurated on 2 April 2009, with an operation of approximately 80% of the route.

In turn, nearly 154 million passengers used city transport by bus in June, 0.4% less than in June 2009. Almost all of the Autonomous Communities presented negative rates in June for city transport by bus, except País Vasco (7.7%), Galicia (2.0%), Castilla-La Mancha (1.6%) and Comunidad de Madrid (1.0%). Canarias (-4.9%) and Comunitat Valenciana (-4.3%) presented the greatest decreases in the interannual rate.

### Annual rates and number of passengers average Urban transport by road



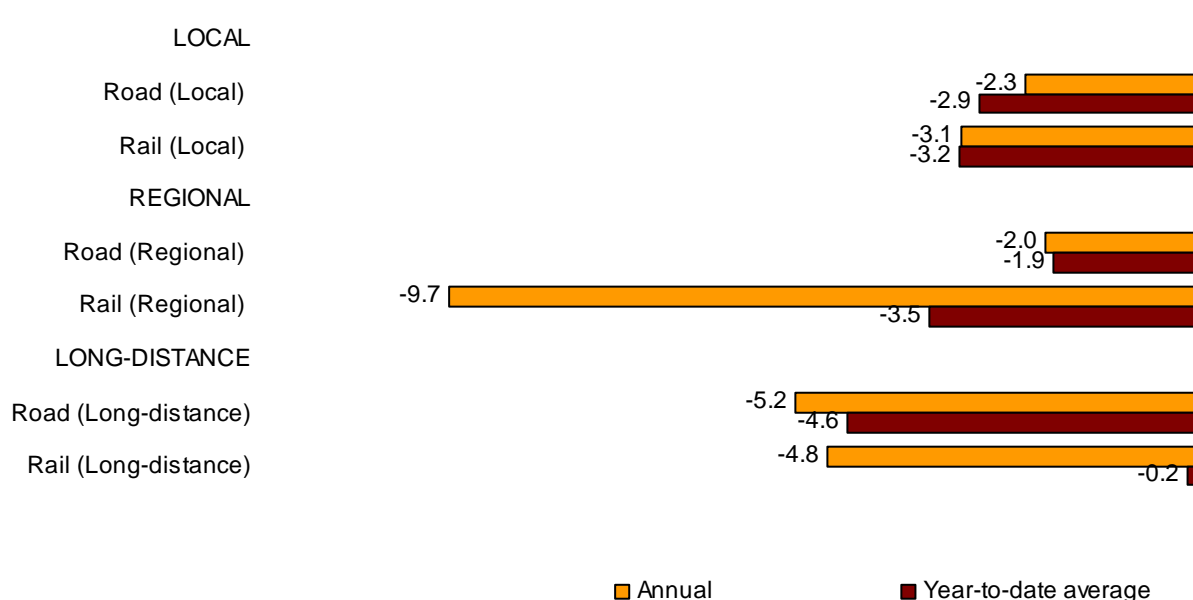
## Inter-city transport

The number of inter-city transport passengers reached nearly 112 million in the month of June, indicating an interannual decrease of 2.6%. By type of transport, **rail** transport (-3.6%) and **road** (bus) transport (-2.3%) registered interannual decreases.

Among rail transport passengers, a decrease of 9.7% was registered in regional transport, 4.8% in long-distance transport and 3.1% in local transport

In turn, among bus transport passengers, decreases were registered in long-distance (5.2%), local (2.3%) and regional (2.0%).

## Special and unscheduled transport

Almost 52 million passengers used special and unscheduled transport in June, indicating a 3.9% decrease in the interannual rate.

Special transport passengers decreased 4.1%, standing at more than 33 million. Within this, both transport modalities decreased (work transport 2.9% and school transport 4.6%).

In turn, unscheduled transport decreased 3.3% as compared with the same month the previous year, reaching more 18 million passengers.
