## Passenger Transport Statistics (PT)

June 2012. *Provisional data*

### Main results

- The number of passengers using **city transport decreases 3.2%** in June 2012, as compared with the same month the previous year.
- The number of passengers using city transport and inter-city transport decreases 3.4% in the interannual rate.
- Special and unscheduled transport decreases a 2.1%, as compared with the same month the previous year.


### Passengers transport evolution

More than 400 million passengers used public transport in June, 3.2% less than the same month the previous year.

The average number of the total passengers decreased 2.3% for the first semester of the year, as compared with the same period of the previous year. By type of transport, all types presented negative average rates during this period.

## City transport. National results and by Autonomous Community


City transport was used by more than 243.8 million passengers in June, 3.4% less than the same month of the previous year.

Metropolitan transport decreased 2.4% in its interannual rate. All metropolitans registered drops in their interannual rates, except Palma, which registered an increase of 7.8%, and Barcelona, which registered an increase of 0.2%.

City transport by bus decreased 4.1% in the interannual rate, with nearly 145.2 million passengers in June.

All Autonomous Community, except Cataluña (3.9%) and Aragón (0.0%), registered negative rates in city transport by bus in June. The higher interannual rates decreases were Principado de Asturias (-16.2%) and Castilla-La Mancha (-12.1%).

### Annual rates and number of passengers average Urban transport by road




## Inter-city transport

More than 109.6 million passengers used inter-city transport in June, indicating an interannual decrease of 3.4%.

All types of transport registered decreases in June, except **sea** transport, which registered an increase of 3.9%. **Air** transport registered a decrease of 8.4%, **rail** transport decreased 3.3% and **bus** transport decreased 3.2%.

Local distance passengers decreased 3.5% for rail transport, and 2.6% for bus transport. Regional passengers distance decreased 4.2% for bus transport and increased 1.1% for rail transport. Finally, long-distance passengers decreased 7.7% in bus transport and decreased 3.8% in rail transport.

## Special and unscheduled transport

Nearly 46.7 million passengers used special and unscheduled transport in June, indicating a decrease of 2.1% in the interannual rate.

Special transport passengers decreased 1.7%, standing near to 29.9 million. Within this, work transport decreased 3.2% and school 1.2%.

In turn, unscheduled transport decreased 2.7%, as compared with the same month the previous year, reaching almost 16.8 million passengers.
