# Passenger Transport Statistics October 2008. Provisional data

The number of passengers using city transport increases 0.4% in October as compared with the same month of the previous year

# The number of passengers using inter-city transport increases 0.7% in the interannual rate

More than 296.3 million passengers used **city transport** in October, representing a 0.4% increase with regard to the same month of 2007. Increases of 1.1% in the metropolitan service were recorded in October, while the bus service recorded practically no change.

On the other hand, **inter-city transport** was used by nearly 175.5 million passengers, that is, 0.7% more than during the same month of the previous year.



# General scheduled city transport by bus decreases 0.1%

More than 171.8 million passengers used the general scheduled city bus in the last month of October, representing a decrease of 0.1% as compared with the same month of 2007.

By Autonomous Community it is worth noting the interannual increase registered in Andalucía (5.6%) and the decrease registered in Extremadura (-5.6%).

#### Transport by special scheduled city bus increases 1.7%

During the month of October, the special scheduled city bus service experienced an increase of 1.7% in the interannual rate. Within this, special scheduled school bus service registered an increase of 3.9%, while special scheduled work bus service experienced a decrease of 4.7%.

# Transport by metropolitan increases 1.1% in the interannual rate

The number of passengers using the metropolitan increased 1.1% in October as compared with the same month in 2007. Increases were recorded in Valencia (2.6%), Barcelona (2.5%) and Bilbao (2.3%), while the Madrid metropolitan presented a slight decrease.

# Inter-city transport increases 0.7% as compared with October 2007

The number of passengers on inter-city transport was approximately 175.5 million during the month of October, representing an interannual increase of 0.7%.

In road transport, the number of passengers using the bus to commute increased 1.3% in the interannual rate. Increases were registered in both scheduled transport modalities, 2.4% among users of general scheduled transport and 1.5% among users of special scheduled transport. In contrast, non-scheduled transport decreased 3.7% as compared with the same month the previous year.

Railway transport increased 0.6% in the interannual rate. This increase was mainly due to the increase of passengers using RENFE AVE-Long Distance (28.5%).
