Industrial Price Index (IPRI). Base 2005
May 2012. *Provisional data*

Main results

- The **interannual** rate of the IPRI for the month of May is **3.2%**, two tenths above the rate registered in April.
- The **monthly** variation of the general index is **-0.1%**.
- All **Autonomous Communities** register **positive interannual** rates in May, except Comunitat Valenciana and La Rioja.
- The Autonomous Community that records the greatest interannual variation is **Canarias**, with **5.9%**.

Annual evolution of industrial prices

The interannual variation of the Industrial Price Index (IPRI) stood at 3.2% in May, two tenths above the rate registered in April.

By economic destination of the goods, the only industrial sectors with a positive effect on the general index was:

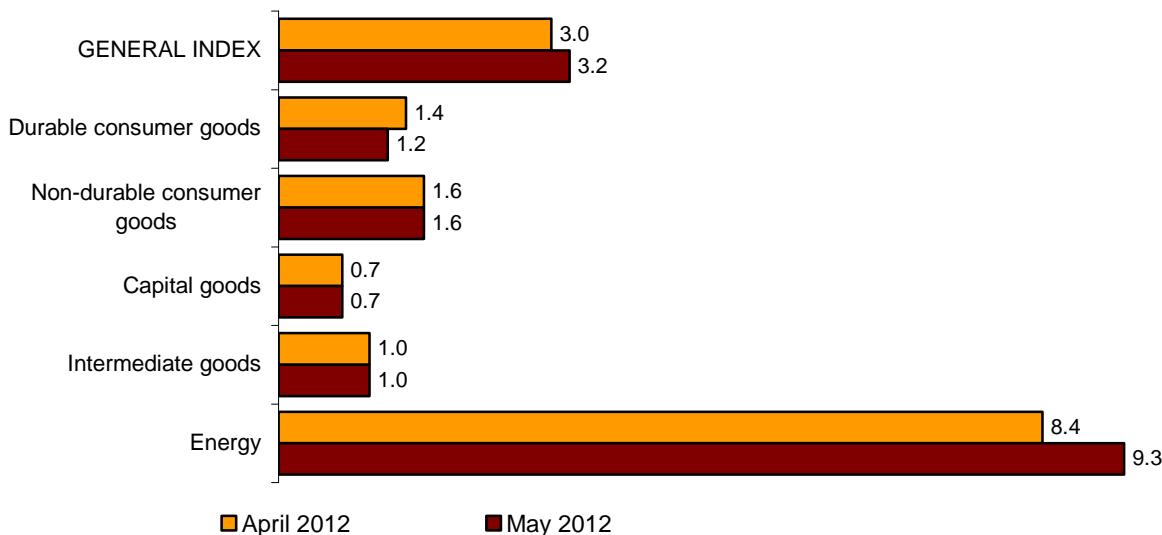
- **Energy**, whose interannual variation increased nine tenths, standing at **9.3%**. This rise was due to the increase in prices of *Production, transport and distribution of electrical energy* and *Production of gas; distribution of gaseous fuels through pipes*.

Within this sector worth noting the decrease of the annual rate of *Petroleum refinement* (10.6%), reaching its lowest level since November 2009.

On the other hand, within the industrial sector with a positive effect, the most notable was the following:

- **Non-durable consumer goods**, whose annual rate stood at **1.2%**, two tenths lower than that registered in April, the lowest since September 2010. The activities that highlight by their influence in this drop were *Manufacture of household appliances* and *Manufacture of jewellery, costume jewellery and similar*.

Monthly evolution of industrial prices

In May, the monthly variation of the IPRI was **-0.1%**.

By economic destination of the goods, the sector that presented the greatest negative monthly effect on the general index was:

- **Energy**, with a monthly variation of **-0.5%**, that reflected the increase in prices of *Petroleum refinement*. Its effect on the general index was **-0.131**.

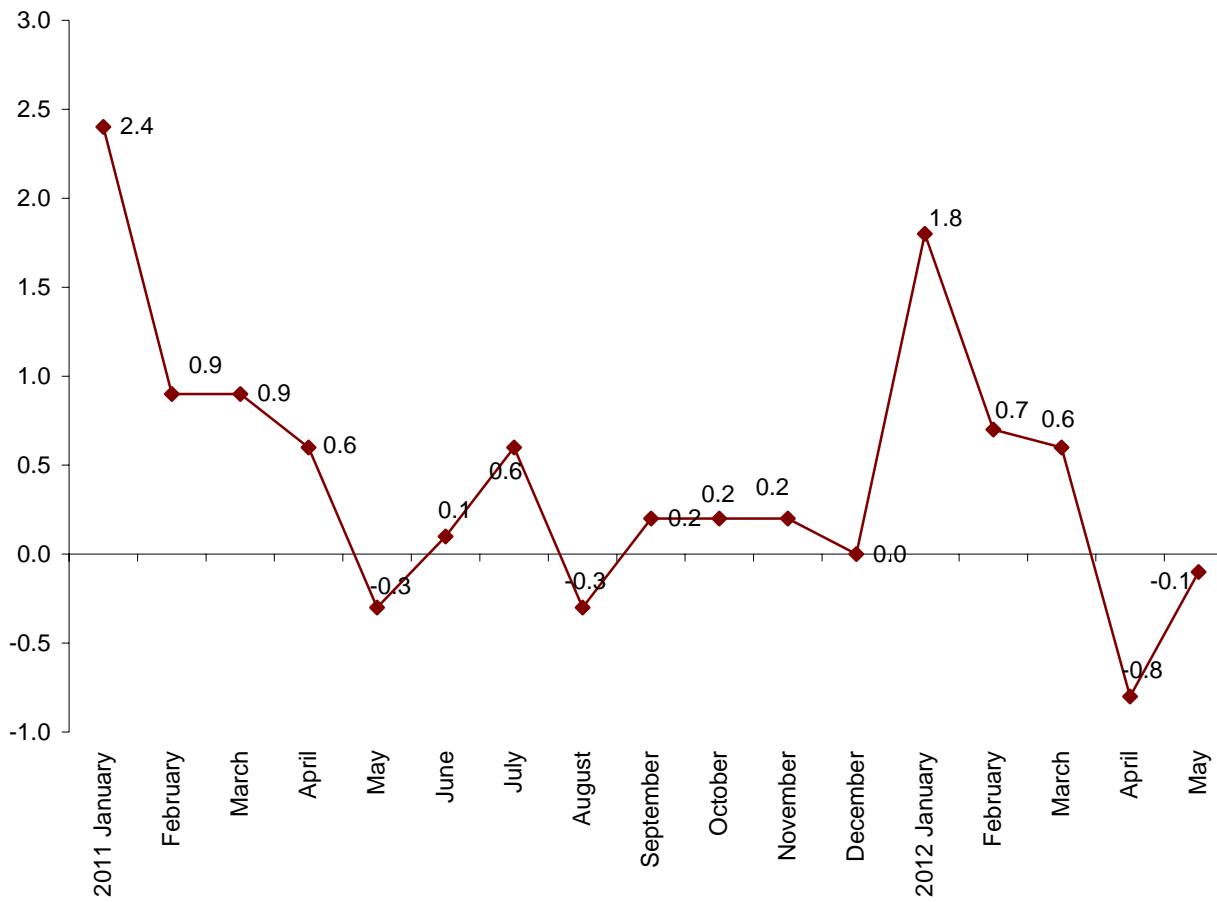
Despite the drop in the annual rate of this sector, worth noting was the rise in the rate of the *Production, transport and distribution of electrical energy* (2.1%) and *Production of gas; distribution of gaseous fuels through pipes* (4.7%).

On the other hand, the industrial sectors with the most positive effect on the general index were:

- **Intermediate goods**, whose monthly rate of **0.2%** contributed **0.052**. Worth noting in this variation the increase in prices of *Manufacture of animal feed products* and *Manufacture of cables and cable devices*.

- **Non-durable consumer goods**, with monthly variation of **0.1%** and contributed **0.019**, mainly due to the increase in prices of *Processing and preserving of meat and production of meat products* and *Manufacture of vegetable and animal oils and fats*.

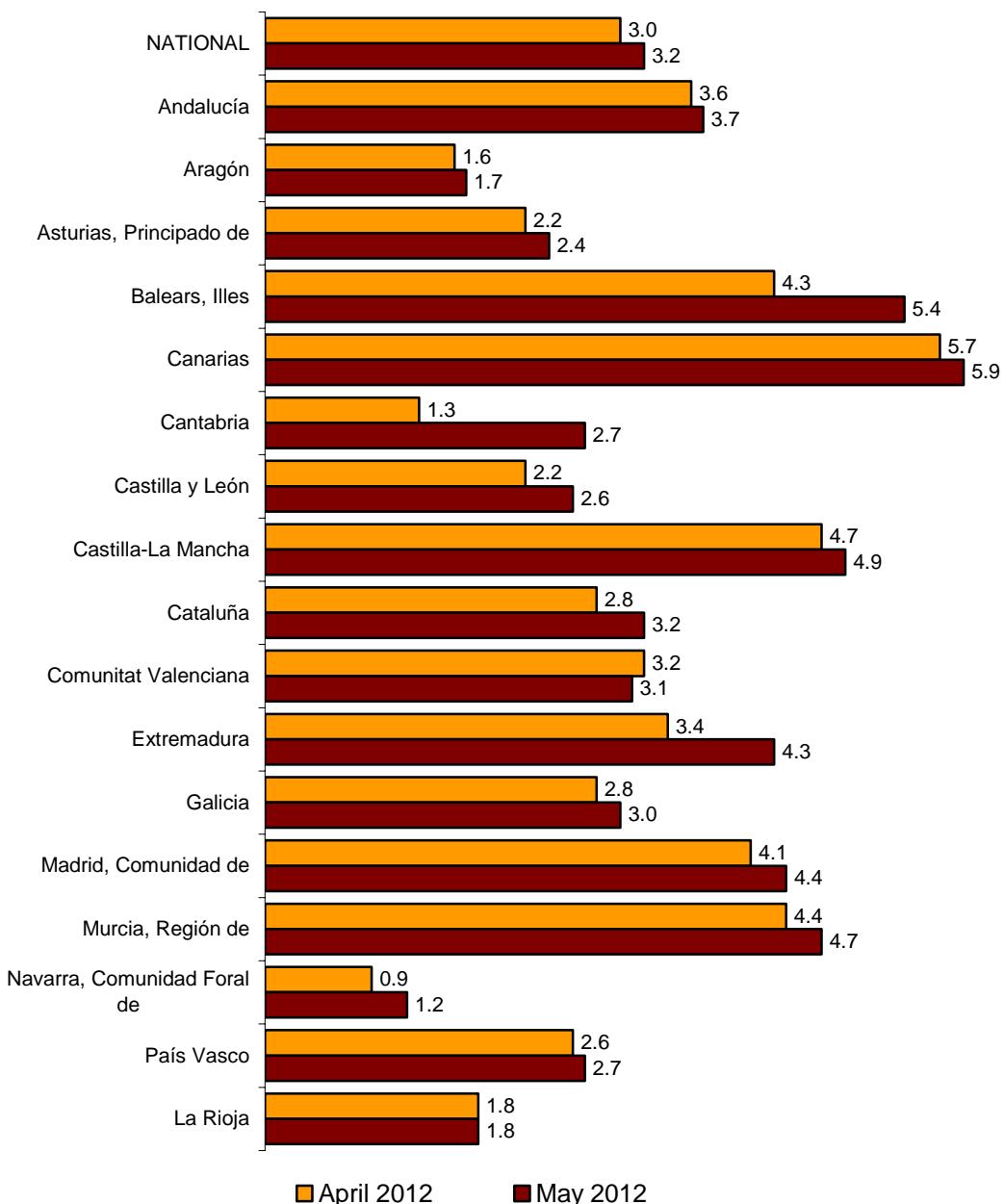

Results by Autonomous Community. Annual variation rates

In almost all Autonomous Communities the annual rate increased in May. The greatest increases corresponded to Cantabria (1.4 points), Illes Balears (1.1 points) and Extremadura (0.9 points), whose rates stood at 2.7%, 5.4% and 4.3%, respectively.

In turn, Comunitat Valenciana was the only Autonomous Community that decreased its annual rate (0.1 points), standing at 3.1%.
