Quarterly Labour Cost Survey (QLCS)

Third quarter 2023


Main results

- The labour cost of companies stands at 2,892.73 euros per worker per month in the third quarter, with a variation of 5.0% compared with the same period in 2022.
- The wage cost per worker per month increases by 4.2%, standing at an average of 2,117.80 euros. On the other hand, other costs increase by 7.2%, standing at 774.93 euros per worker per month.
- During the third quarter, the average agreed-upon working week, including both full-time and part-time work, is 35.3 hours. Of these, 7.5 hours per week are lost, most of which (6.2) were due to vacations and public holidays.
- The labour cost per effective hour rises by 5.5% in the annual rate, as a consequence of the 0.5% growth in hours worked.
- In quarterly rate, and with calendar adjusted data and deseasonalised, the quarterly rate of the labour cost per worker is 0.7% and that of the cost per effective hour 1.1%.
- The number of vacancies is 155,797 in the third quarter. Of these, 90.2% are in the Services sector.

Labour cost by components

The labour cost per worker per month reaches 2,892.73 euros in the third quarter of 2023, which is an increase of 5.0% compared with the same period of the previous year.

Of the total cost per worker and month, incurred by an employer for the use of labour, wages and salaries accounted for 2,117.80 euros and compulsory social insurance contributions accounted for 724.95 euros. The rest corresponded to compensations, social benefits, etc.

The cost of wages and salaries, which includes base salary, wage supplements, overtime payments, extraordinary payments and delayed payments, measured in gross terms, rises by 4.2% at an annual rate, going from 2,032.05 to 2,117.80 euros per worker per month. If the variable factor is excluded from wages (extraordinary and delayed payments), the ordinary wage cost is obtained, which varies by 4.5%.

Other costs (non-wage costs) increased by 7.2%. Their main component, compulsory social insurance contributions, increased by 7.2%. In the variation of non-salary income, the increase in severance payments is noteworthy.

The hourly labour cost increased by 5.5% due to the 0.5% decrease in the number of effective working hours.

Labour cost by economic sector

Construction displays the lowest rise in the cost of wages and salaries.

Industry presents an increase of 4.5% in labour costs and 3.5% in the cost of wages and salaries this quarter. In the variation of other costs, the increase in severance payments is noteworthy.

The largest increases in the cost of labour and its main components are recorded in *Services*.


Labour cost by activity sector

By sections of activity, the growth in labour costs is highest in *Real estate activities, Information and communications* and *Artistic, recreational and entertainment activities*.

In contrast, the cost decreases in *Mining and quarrying industries* and registers its smallest increases in *Supplies of electrical energy, gas, steam and air conditioning* and *Health and social services activities*.

Considering the per worker labour cost components, the wage cost growth is highest in *Real estate activities, Information and communications* and *Artistic, recreational and entertainment activities*.

As for salaries, they fall in *Mining and quarrying industries*. We can observe the smallest increases this quarter in the *Supplies of electrical energy, gas, steam and air conditioning* and *Health and social services activities* sections.

With regard to other costs, the sections that recorded the greatest annual increases were *Public administration and defence, Compulsory social insurance contributions, Professional, scientific and technical activities* and *Mining and quarrying Industries*.

The lowest rates are recorded in *Health and social service activities, Water supplies, Sanitation activities, waste management and decontamination* and *Administrative activities and auxiliary services*.

Regarding the wage cost per hour worked, the sections that register the largest increases are *Real estate activities, Information and communications* and *Artistic, recreational and entertainment activities*.

In contrast, the salary per hour worked decreases in *Mining and quarrying industries* and *Supplies of electrical energy, gas, steam and air conditioning*.

With regard to other costs per hour worked, the sections that record the greatest annual increases are *Public administration and defence, Compulsory social insurance contributions, Professional, scientific and technical activities* and *Mining and quarrying Industries*.


The lowest rates occur in *Transport and storage, Education and water supply* and *Sanitation activities, waste management and decontamination*.

Labour cost by Autonomous Community

The labour cost in Comunidad de Madrid and País Vasco exceeds the national average by more than 400 euros. In Extremadura and Canarias this cost is lower than the average by the same amount.

With regard to the annual growth in costs, Comunidad de Madrid, La Rioja and Illes Balears show the highest variation rates. In contrast, Comunitat Valenciana, Extremadura and Canarias record the smallest increases.


Working time

During the third quarter, the average agreed-upon working week, including both full-time and part-time work, is 35.3 hours. Of these, an average of 7.5 hours are lost per week, most of which (6.2) are due to vacations and public holidays.

The remainder of the non-worked hours (1.3) are due to other possible causes such as temporary disability, maternity or paternity leave, paid leave, etc.

If we add overtime and subtract lost hours, the working week is reduced to 27.9 effective working hours.

By type of working day, the wage difference between full-time and part-time workers is 5.78 euros per hour (18.27 euros/hour for full-time versus 12.49 euros/hour for part-time).

Regarding work time, full-time workers perform 61% more effective hours than part-time workers (30.4 hours per week, as compared with 18.9).


Series adjusted for seasonal and calendar effects

In order to contribute to the analysis and interpretation of the data, the main QLCS series are provided for the whole economy, adjusted for seasonal and calendar effects.

Between the third and second quarters of 2023, the variation of the total labour cost per worker is 0.7%, after adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects.

Job vacancies

In the third quarter of 2023 the number of vacancies stands at 155,797. Of those, 90.2% are in the Services sector.

Most of the units interviewed answered that they do not have vacancies to be filled this quarter because they do not need additional workers.

Vacancies by sector. Third quarter 2023



Vacancies by Autonomous Community

The Autonomous Communities registering the greatest number of vacancies in this quarter are Comunidad de Madrid, Cataluña and Andalucía. In turn, those recording the lowest number are Cantabria, La Rioja and Extremadura.

Looking at the percentage distribution, Comunidad de Madrid, Cataluña and Andalucía had 56% of the total vacancies this quarter.

Revision and updating of data

The data published today are final. All the results are available on INEBase.

Methodological note

The Quarterly Labour Cost Survey (QLCS) is a quarterly continuous statistical operation whose main objective is to know the evolution of the average labour cost per worker per month, the average labour cost per hour actually worked, and the time worked and not worked. As of the third quarter of 2013, information on unmet labour demand is also obtained in the vacancies section.

In addition, the QLCS It is the main source of information for the preparation of the Harmonised Labour Cost Index (HLCI), which forms part of the euroindicators of the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat).

Type of operation: quarterly continuous survey.

Base year: 2020.

Population scope: Social Security contribution accounts. General Scheme: Sections B to S of CNAE-09 and Special Scheme for Seafarers: Sea Transport (Division 50 of CNAE-09).

Geographical scope: the entire national territory.

Reference period of the results: the calendar quarter.

Reference period of the information: the calendar month.

Sample size: 28,500 establishments, distributed in three monthly subsamples of 9,500 establishments.

Type of sampling: stratified random sampling with optimal allocation. Comprehensive survey for establishments with more than 500 employees.

Collection method: questionnaire filled in directly by the establishment.
