Estadística de Movimientos Turísticos en Fronteras (FRONTUR) April 2021. Provisional data

Spain received 630,647 international tourists in April

Germany is the main country of residence, with 143,769 tourists, accounting for 22.8% of the total

The high alert period for the management of the health crisis situation caused by COVID-19 suppressed the flow of international visitors to Spain for tourist reasons in April 2020. For thus, there were not visitor's entry during this month.

For this reason, it is not possible to calculate variation rates of April 2021 with respect the same month last year for this survey.

Inflow of tourists

Spain received in April the visit of 630,647 international tourists. Germany was the main country of residence, with 143,769 tourists, accounting for 22.8% of the total.

France and Italy were the following countries with the most tourists visiting Spain. From France we received 116,340 and Italy 40,509 tourists.

In the accumulated first four months of 2021 the number of tourists visiting Spain decreased by 82.6% and exceed 1.8 million. Nearly 10.6 million of international tourists came in the same period last year.

The main sending countries so far this year were France (with 418,409 tourists and a decrease of 69.2% as compared to the first four months of 2020), Germany (with 331,239 tourists, and a decrease of 74.5%) and Rest of Europe (with 289,146 tourists, 72.0% less).

Main destination Autonomous Communities

Illes Balears was the main tourist destination in April, with 19.8% of the total. It was followed by Canarias (17.4%) and Cataluña (15.0%).

124,674 tourists came to Illes Balears. The main countries of residence of tourists visiting this Autonomous Community were Germany (with 80,952 tourists) and Switzerland (with 12,468 tourists).

The number of tourists visiting Canarias was 109,468 tourists. 38,593 tourists came from Rest of Europe and 27,487 tourists from Germany.

The third main destination Autonomous Community by number of tourists was Cataluña, with 94,391 tourists. France was the main country of origin (with 28,324 tourists), followed by Rest of Europe (with 15,172 tourists).

In the accumulated first four months of 2021, the Autonomous Communities that received the most tourists were Canarias (with 370,841 tourists and a decrease of 86.4% as compared with the same period in 2020), Cataluña (with 319,298 and a decrease of 85.7%) and Illes Balears (with 218,649 tourists, a 46.0% less).

Forms of access and main means of accommodation

Most tourists visiting Spain in April came by air, with 480,650 tourists.

Road entries arrived 137,320 tourists, railway accessed 6,930 tourists and port arrivals arrived 5,747 tourists.

International tourist arrivals by main means of access to Spain

In April, the number of tourists choosing market accommodation was the main type of accommodation with 461,032 tourists. Within this type, hotel accommodation was the main type of accommodation with 393,454 tourists. Rented dwellings accounted 44,855.

On the other hand, non-market accommodation accounted 169,615 tourists. The number of tourists staying in relatives or friends' homes was 81,366 tourists and that of those staying in their own dwelling was 77,020.

(*):Two principal groups of accommodation are distinguished, depending on whether there has been a monetary transaction: market accommodation (paid accommodation; hotels, rented accommodation, camp sites, country houses and other market accommodation) and non-market accommodation (own home, relatives or friends' homes and other non-market accommodation).

Main reason, length of stay and organization of the trip

In April, *Leisure, recreation, and holidays* were the main reasons for travelling to Spain for 392,185 tourists.

A total of 132,541 tourists arrived for *Business and professional reasons* and 105,921 arrived for *Other reasons*.

International tourist arrivals by main purpose of the trip

A stay of four to seven nights was the main length among tourists in April, with 268,095 tourists.

The number of visitors without overnight stays (excursionists) stood by 617,948. Tourists with longer duration (more than 15 nights) were 84,162 tourists.

Revision and updating of data

Coinciding with today's publication, INE has updated the data corresponding to the month of April 2020. The results are available at INEBase.

Methodological note

The main objective of the Tourist Movement on Borders Survey (FRONTUR) is to estimate the number of non-residents visiting Spain on a monthly basis, as well as to know the main characteristics of the trips made by these visitors.

For the preparation of FRONTUR the international definitions and recommendations of the UNWTO and EUROSTAT in this field are followed.

Type of operation: continuous monthly statistics.

Population scope: this refers to non-residents in Spain who enter our country, whether or not they have stayed overnight, as well as those who pass through our country in transit.

Geographical scope: the entire national territory. The sample is collected at the main access points for non-resident travellers, both by road, airport, port and rail.

Reference period of the results: the month.

Sample size: the annual theoretical sample size of FRONTUR exceeds 450,000 surveys, which are distributed throughout the year, taking into account the seasonality of passenger flows.

Type of sampling: the sample design, a series of strata have been defined for each form of entry that group together border points, airports, ports or railway lines, respectively. In the road and airport sample allocation, the day of the week in which the survey has been carried out is also identified, differentiating between working days, weekends and holidays. Furthermore, in airports 20 air relations are defined (Spanish airport of origin-country of destination airport) which also determine the sample design in this form of access.

Collection method: information is collected by direct interview when the traveller leaves Spain, using a multilingual electronic questionnaire.
