Harmonised Labour Cost Index (HLCI). Base 2008 First quarter of 2009. Provisional data

The cost per hour worked increases 1.5% in the first quarter of 2010 with respect to the same period of 2009

The increase stands at 2.1% if adjusted for calendar and seasonal effects

The cost per hour worked increased 1.5% in the first quarter as compared with the same period of 2009. After adjusting for seasonal and calendar effects, the interannual rate stood at 2.1%.

On the other hand, the provisional data from the Harmonised Labour Cost Index corresponding to the fourth quarter of 2009 was reviewed. The general index stood at 110.4, indicating a definitive interannual increase of 4.9%, as compared with the same period from the previous year. Once adjusted for calendar and seasonal effects, the growth rate stood at 4.0%.

The data from the Harmonised Labour Cost Index (HLCI) is sent every quarter to the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat) for its subsequent publication by this body, thus complying with the statistical requirement established in the action plan of the European Monetary Union.
