The cost per hour worked increases 1.6% in the first quarter of 2012, with regard to the same period of 2011

The variation stands at 1.8% after adjusting for calendar and seasonal effects

The cost per hour worked increased 1.6% in the first quarter of 2012, as compared with the same period the previous year. The interannual rate stood at 1.8% after adjusting for calendar and seasonal effects.

On the other hand, the provisional data for the Harmonised Labour Cost Index corresponding to the fourth quarter of 2011 was reviewed, with the final index standing at 113.5 in terms of gross data. Adjusted for calendar and seasonal effects, the growth rate decreased one tenth and stood at 2.7%.

The data from the Harmonised Labour Cost Index (HLCI) is sent each quarter to the Statistical Office of the European Communities (Eurostat) for its subsequent publication by this body, thus complying with the statistical requirement established in the action plan of the European Monetary Union.
