Industrial New Orders Received Indices (INORI). Base 2015 August 2018. Provisional data


The monthly variation of the Total Industrial New Orders Receives Index¹ stands at 3.8%, after seasonal and calendar adjustment

The annual rate stands at 7.5% in the seasonal and calendar adjusted series and at 7.7% in the original series

Monthly trend of Industrial New Orders Received

The monthly variation of the seasonally and calendar adjusted Industrial New Orders Received Index between August and July stood at 3.8%. This rate was 4.5 points higher than the previous month.


Industrial New Orders Received Index, Total

¹ As reflected in the methodology of this value index, the information is presented in current terms (nominal terms), this is, without adjusting the price variation effects.

By Main Industrial Groupings (MIGs), all sectors showed positive monthly rates. It is worth highlighting the increase in *Capital goods* (12.5%).



Annual trend of Industrial New Orders Received

The Total Industrial New Orders Received Index, once adjusted for seasonal and calendar effects, showed a variation of 7.5% in August, as compared with the same month of the previous year. This rate was 4.7 points higher than the one registered in July.

The INORI original series of the registered an annual variation of 7.7%. This rate was two points higher than the one in July.

By MIGs, the seasonally and calendar adjusted indices registered positive annual rates in four of five of the analysed sectors, highlighting the increase in *Energy*²(36.4%).



Annual trend of the Industrial New Orders Received by market. Original series

In August all markets showed positive annual rates. It is worth noting the increase registered in the euro area in the non-domestic market (11.3%).


Industrial New Orders Received Index, Total and by market August 2018. Annual rate



Results by Autonomous Community. Annual rate of the Industrial New Orders Received. Original series

New orders received increased as compared to August 2017 in 13 Autonomous Communities and decreased in the other four. The largest increases were recorded in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (41.8%), Región de Murcia (15.8%) and Castilla-La Mancha (13.7%). The largest decreases were recorded in Canarias (–8.8%), Galicia (–1.8%) and Illes Balears (–0.7%).

Revisions and data update

On the press release day, INE has updated INORI data series corresponding to the last 13 months. In the case of calendar adjusted and seasonally and calendar adjusted series, according to INE standard, the series are revised since its beginning. The results are available at INEBase.

Methodological note

Industrial New Orders Received Indices (INORI) are short-term indicators aiming at measuring the monthly evolution of the industrial sector, excluding the construction.

The required information is collected since January 2002, together with the Industrial Turnover Indices (ITI) through a survey addressed to more than 12.000 industrial establishments throughout the country.

Survey Type: ongoing monthly.

Base year: 2015.

Population scope: units of economic activity whose main activity is included in Sections B: Extractive industries (with the exception, due to their not being relevant to Spanish industry, of division 09) or C: Manufacturing industry of CNAE-2009.

Geographical scope: the whole country, excluding Ceuta and Melilla.

Sample size: Approx. 12,000 establishments.

Data collection: monthly, value of total business turnover broken down by market.

Collection method: fill in a questionnaire by the respondent using one of the following methods: internet (IRIA system), email, fax, telephone or post.
