Industrial Turnover Indices. Base 2005 Industrial New Orders Received Indices. Base 2005

February 2010. Provisional data

Main Results

- The annual rate of the **General Industrial Turnover Index** increases more than six-and-a-half points since January, standing at **7.4%**.
- By economic destination of the goods, consumer goods (durable and non-durable) are the only ones registering negative interannual variations.
- The **average rate** of the Industrial Turnover Index registers an increase of **4.1%** in the first two months of the year.
- The annual variation rate of **New Orders Received** increases nearly six points compared with that registered in January, standing at **7.9%**.
- The **average rate** of the General Industrial New Orders Received Index stands at **5.0%** in January and February.

Evolution of Industrial Turnover

The General Industrial Turnover Index (ITI) experienced an interannual variation of **7.4%** in February, more than six-and-a-half points higher than that registered in January.

By economic destination of the goods, the industrial sectors that presented the greatest positive effects on the general index were:

- Capital goods, with an annual rate of 19.6%, and an effect of 4.491 on the general index, caused by the increase in invoicing of the *Manufacture of motor vehicles*, *trailers and semi-trailers*.
- •Intermediate goods, with an annual variation of 5.4%, and an effect of 1.999 on the general index. Among the activities of this sector with a positive effect worth noting was Metallurgy; manufacture of iron, steel and ferro-alloy products.
- Energy, with an annual variation of 25.9% and an effect of 1.635 on the general index, fundamentally due to the increase in *Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products*.

Amongst the sectors industrial sectors that had a negative effect on the overall index, the most relevant was:

• Non-durable consumer goods, with an annual variation of –2.2% and an effect of –0.671. This rate was explained by the decreases registered in half of the activities that comprise the sector, among which, worth noting was *Manufacture of garments*.

Details of interannual variations

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that most affected the annual rate of the ITI in the month of February.


Year-to-date average rates

The average rate of the Industrial Turnover Index registered an increase of **4.1%** in the first two months of the year.


By economic destination of the goods, Energy (24.1%), Capital goods (13.8%) and Intermediate goods (2.6%) presented positive average rates. Conversely, Consumer goods (Durable and Non-durable) registered negative average rates during said period.

Evolution of Industrial New Orders Received

The General Industrial New Orders Received Index (INORI) experienced an interannual variation of **7.9%** in February, almost six points above that registered in January.

By economic destination of the goods, all of the industrial sectors presented a positive effect on the general index. Amongst them worth noting were:

- Intermediate goods, with an annual variation of 7.9% and an effect on the overall index of 2.916, fundamentally due to the increase experienced in the new orders received in Metallurgy, manufacture of iron, steel and ferro-alloy products. Compared to this increase, it was important to note the negative effect of the Manufacture of other non-metallic ore products.
- Capital goods, with an annual rate of 12.1%, and an effect of 2.698 on the general index, caused by the increase in new orders received in the *Manufacture of motor vehicles*, *trailers and semi-trailers*. Worth noting, however, were the decreases observed in the *Manufacture of metal products for construction, containers made of metal, steam generators, weapons and ammunition.*

Details of the interannual variations

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that most affected the annual rate of the INORI in the month of February.




The average rate of the Industrial New Orders Received Index in January and February registered a variation rate of 5.0%, compared with the same period the previous year.
