Industrial Turnover Indices (ITI). Base 2005
Industrial New Orders Received Indices (INORI). Base 2005
October 2011. *Provisional data*

Main results

- The annual rate of the **Industrial Turnover Index** stands at **0.0%** in the month of October, more than four points lower than that registered in September.
- By economic destination of the goods, **all sectors register negative interannual rates, except Non-durable consumer goods and Energy**.
- The **variation of average Turnover** is **6.0%** in the first ten months of the year.
- The annual variation rate of **New Orders Received** in the month of October is **0.9%**, four-and-a-half points lower than in September.
- The **average rate** of the General Industrial New Orders Received Index stands at **6.5%** in the first ten months of the year.

Evolution of Industrial Turnover

The Industrial Turnover Index (ITI) didn't experience an interannual variation in October, standing at four points lower than that registered in September.

By economic destination of the goods, the industrial sectors that presented the greatest negative effects on the general index were:

- **Intermediate goods**, with an annual rate of **-3.9%** and an effect of **-1.438** on the general index, due to the decreased registered in almost all activities comprising this sector. Among these drops, worth highlighting were *Manufacture of other non-metallic products* and *Manufacture of electrical material and equipment except household appliances*. Nevertheless, worth noting was the increase in the *Manufacture of grain mill products, starches and starch products and of prepared animal feeds*.
- **Capital goods**, with an annual rate of **-2.9%** and an effect of **-0.668**, motivated by the drops in the most of the activities comprising this sector. Among these drops, worth highlighting were *Naval, railway, aircraft and spacecraft construction*. *Combat vehicles* and *Manufacture of metal products for construction, containers made of metal, steam generators, weapons and ammunition*. Nevertheless, the contraction in turnover in this sector is attenuated by the increase recorded in the *Manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers*.

- **Durable consumer goods**, with an annual variation of **-17.5%** and an effect of **-0.493** on the general index, due to the negative evolution in all activities.

In turn, the industrial sectors that presented the greatest positive effect on the general index were:

- **Energy**, with an annual variation of **26.3%** and an effect of **2.133** on the general index, motivated to the increase observed in the *Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products*.
- **Non-durable consumer goods**, with an annual rate of **1.6%** and an effect of **0.450**. Turnover increased in half of the activities in this sector, with the increase in the *Food industries (except grain mill products and food for animals)* worth noting, due to its influence.

Details of the interannual variations

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that had the greatest effect on the annual rate of the ITI for the month of October.



Year-to-date average rates

The average for the Industrial Production Index registered a variation rate of **6.0%** in the first ten months of the year, as compared with the same period the previous year.

By economic destination of the goods, this rate was positive in Energy (34.6%), Intermediate goods (6.8%), Non-durable consumer goods (2.3%) and Capital goods (1.6%). In contrast, it was negative in Durable consumer goods (-12.8%).


**Annual rates and the average of ITI

Evolution of the ITI, adjusted for the calendar effect

After eliminating the calendar effect, that is, the difference between the number of working days in a given month in different years, the interannual variation of the ITI in the month of October was 0.3%, four points lower than that registered in September.

Evolution of Industrial New Orders Received

The Industrial New Orders Received Index (INORI) experienced an interannual variation of **0.9%** in October, four-and-a-half points below that registered in September.

By economic destination of the goods, the industrial sectors that presented the greatest positive effects on the general index were:

- **Energy**, with an annual variation of **27.0%** and an effect of **2.227** on the general index, mainly due to the increase in new orders received in the *Manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products*.
- **Non-durable consumer goods**, with an annual rate of **1.8%** and an effect of **0.529**. New orders increased in more than half of the activities in this sector, with the increase in the *Food industries (except grain mill products and food for animals)* worth noting, due to its influence.

In turn, the only industrial sector with a negative effect on the general index was:

- **Intermediate goods**, with an annual variation of **-4.1%** and an effect of **-1.584**, in the general index, caused by the negative evolution of all activities comprising this sector.

Details of the interannual variations

A more detailed analysis showed the activities that most affected the annual rate of the INORI in the month of October.



Year-to-date average rates

The average rate of the General Industrial New Orders Received Index during the first ten months of the year presented a variation of **6.5%**, as compared with the same period the previous year. By economic destination of the goods, this rate was positive in all industrial sectors, except in Durable consumer goods.


**Annual rates and the average of INORI

After eliminating the calendar effect, that is, the difference between the number of working days in a given month in different years, the interannual variation of the INORI in the month of October was 1.2%, more than four points lower than that registered in September.
