# The annual variation rate of the Housing Price Index decreased more than one point, standing at 3.6%

#### Housing prices fell six tenths compared to the previous quarter

#### Annual evolution of housing prices


The annual rate of the Housing Price Index (HPI) in the fourth quarter of 2019 decreased one percentage point, standing at 3.6%. This was the lowest since the first quarter of 2015.

By housing type, the rate of new housing reached 5.3%, 1.3 points below that registered in the previous quarter.

Meanwhile, the annual variation of the price of second hand housing decreased by one point, to 3.4%.

General index, new and second-hand housing. Percentage




#### Quarterly evolution of housing prices

The quarterly evolution of the general HPI in the fourth quarter of 2019 is -0.6%.

#### Quarterly rate of the HPI


Overall index Percentage



By housing type, the prices of new housing decreased two tenths between the third and fourth quarter. Meanwhile, second-hand housing prices decreased by seven tenths.

#### Results by Autonomous Communities. Annual variation rates


The annual rate of IPV decreased in 10 autonomous communities in the fourth quarter compared to the third, and increased in the remaining seven.

The greatest decreases were registered in Pais Vasco, Andalucía and Comunidad de Madrid, with increases of 1.9, 1.8 and 1.7 points, respectively.

On the other hand, País Vasco, Illes Balears and Canarias registered the greatest increases in their annual rates, with increases of nine, nine, and eight tenths, respectively.

#### Results by Autonomous Communities. Quarterly variation rates


Housing prices showed positive quarterly rates in the 10 Autonomous Communities.

The greatest rise occurred in Castilla y León, with an increase of eight tenths.

In turn, País Vasco (-1.9%) and Comunidad Madrid (-1.7%), registered the highest quarterly decreases.

#### Revision and updating of data

The data published today is final and is not subject to further revision. All results are available on INEBase.

#### Methodological note

The main objective of the Housing Price Index (HPI) is to measure the evolution of the sales price of free dwellings acquired by households in Spain, both new and second-hand dwellings, adjusting for changes in the composition and quality of the dwellings acquired in different periods by means of a method that combines stratification with a regression model.

Type of survey: Continuous quarterly survey.

Base period: 2015.

Reference period for the weightings: two years prior to the current year.

**Geographical scope**: the entire national territory.

**Number of observations:** around 95% of housing sales made in the quarter.

Functional classification: New and second-hand housing.

General calculation method: Chained Laspeyres.

Collection method: administrative records.
