

Hotel Tourism Short-Term Trends (HOS/HPI/IPHS)

March 2021. Provisional data

Overnight stays in hotel establishments decrease 57.9% in March with respect to the same month in 2020

Hotels invoice an average of 65.5 euros per occupied room, representing an annual decrease of 16.2%

During the month of March, overnight stays in hotel establishments exceeded 3.5 million, 57.9% less than in the same month of 2020.


Compared with levels prior to the pandemic, overnight stays in hotel establishments in March 2021, showed a decrease of 83.6% compared to March 2019.

On the basis of origin, overnight stays by travellers residing in Spain, which represent 72.5% of the total, decreased by 17.2% in the annual rate. In turn, overnight stays by non-residents fell by 81.7%.

On the other hand, the average stay decreased 35.6% compared to March 2020, standing at 2.0 overnight stays per traveller.


Annual variation rate for overnight stays

Percentage




Overnight stays. Comparison 2019-2020-2021

Open establishments

In March, a total of 8,416 hotels were open in Spain, 22.0% less than in the same month of 2020. This represented 49.3% of the total directory of establishments in this month.



Destinations

Madrid, Cataluña and Canarias were the main destinations of residents in Spain in March, with annual variation rates in the number of overnight stays of -26.9%, -49.2% and -80.4%, respectively.

The main destinations for travellers residing in Spain are Comunidad de Madrid, Cataluña and Andalucía, which present annual rates of variation in overnight stays of -13.4%, -0.8% and -45.3%, respectively.


The main destination chosen by non-residents was Canarias, with 33.9% of total overnight stays. In this Autonomous Community, overnight stays by foreign nationals decreased 86.6% as compared to March 2020. The next most popular destinations of non-residents were Comunidad de Madrid (with a decrease of 60.1%) and Cataluña (with a decrease of 78.9%).

Hotel occupancy

In March, 19.3% of the places offered were covered, with an annual decrease of 34.0%. The weekend occupancy rate by bed-places declined by 29.6%, standing at 22.9%.

Occupancy rate



The autonomous city of Ceuta showed the highest occupancy rate by bed-places in March (28.6%). It was followed by Comunidad de Madrid, with 25.2%.

By tourist areas, El Hierro island reached both the highest level of occupancy by bed-places (27.4%), and the greatest weekend occupancy rate (37.1%). Tenerife had the highest number of overnight stays, with 194,369.

The tourist sites with the most overnight stays were Madrid, Barcelona and San Bartolomé de Tirajana. Santa Cruz de Tenerife recorded the highest occupancy rate by bed-places (34.2%) and Plasencia the greatest weekend occupancy rate (47.4%).


Overnight stays according to the country of origin of the travellers

Travellers from Germany and France accounted for 18.4% and 14.9%, respectively, of total overnight stays of non-residents in hotel establishments in March. The German market had an annual variation rate of -84.3%, and the French market a rate of -59.1%.

Overnight stays of travellers from Italy, Poland and the United Kingdom (the next greatest countries of origin) registered annual rates of -52.2%, -56.0% and -97.3% respectively.

Hotel Prices

The annual rate of the Hotel Prices Index (HPI) stood at -8.1% in March, which is 4.7 points below that registered in the same month of 2020 and 6.3 of a point more than that registered last month.

By categories, the largest price decrease was recorded in establishments with one gold star (-11.7%). And the lowest, in those with five gold stars (-5.2%).

Hotel Sector Profitability

In March, hotels' average daily rate per occupied room (ADR) was 65.5 Euros, representing a decrease of 16.2% compared to the same month in 2020.


On the other hand, the average daily revenue per available room (RevPAR), which is conditioned by the occupancy registered in hotel establishments, reached 17.1 euros, with a 42.9% decrease.

By category, the average rate was 169.2 euros for five-star hotels, 71.7 euros for four-star hotels and 53.6 euros for three-star hotels. Revenue per available room for these same categories were 40.6, 21.1 and 14.8 euros, respectively.


The tourist spot¹ with the highest ADR is Naut Aran, with an average daily billing per occupied room of 173.6 euros. The tourist spot with the highest RevPAR was Adeje, with an income per available room of 50.6 euros.

Revision and updating of data

Coinciding with today's publication, the INE has updated the data corresponding to March 2020 in the Hotel Occupancy Survey (HOS), the Hotel Price Index (HPI) and the Indicators on the Profitability of the Hotel Sector (IPHS).

Methodological note

The main objective of the Hotel Occupancy Survey (HOS) is to ascertain the behaviour of a series of variables that make it possible to describe the fundamental characteristics of the hotel sector, from the viewpoint of both supply and demand, thus meeting the needs of national institutions and the requirements of international organisations for knowledge regarding the sector.

The Hotel Price Index (HPI) is a statistical measure of the monthly evolution of prices applied to clients by hotel entrepreneurs.

The main objective of the Indicators of Profitability of the Hotel Sector (IRSH) is to facilitate decision-making in the hotel sector. These are the *Average Daily Rate* (ADR), which collects the average daily income per occupied room; and the *Revenue per Available Room* (RevPAR), which collects the average daily revenue per available room.

Type of operation: monthly continuous survey.

Population scope: all hotel establishments.

Geographical scope: the entire national territory.

Reference period of the results: the month.

Reference period of the information: seven consecutive days of each month, chosen randomly in such way that, between all the establishments, the entire month is covered.

Sample design: stratified sampling by province and establishment category, with 4 and 5 gold star categories being exhaustive.

Sample size: approximately 9,250 establishments in winter and 11,200 in summer.

Collection method: questionnaire filled in directly by the hotel establishment.
