**Agricultural holding:** It is the set of lands and/or livestock that are under the responsibility of its owner and in which the same means of production are used (machinery, land, facilities, fertilizers...). If they are land or livestock facilities that are sufficiently far apart, so that different labour and machinery are used at each location, it must be understood that it is more than one operation.

**Owner of the holding:** It is a natural person, group of natural persons or legal entity that assumes the legal and economic responsibility of an agricultural or livestock operation and makes decisions regardless of whether or not it is the owner, of its age or employment status (retired or not). He or she can manage it directly or through another person (for example, a family member or other salaried employee).

The owner of unexploited or abandoned land is also considered an agricultural owner, meaning that it is not economically productive and that no other person or company exploits.

### 4. LABOUR FORCE FOR THE HOLDING

**Labour** is understood as all the people (family or non-family) who work on the agricultural holding in agricultural activity (labour on the holding carrying out other non-agricultural lucrative activities is excluded).

#### Calculation of days worked

To **calculate the days worked**, only the hours spent in agricultural activity will be taken into account. Taking into account that 1 agricultural day is equivalent to 8 hours of agricultural work (1 full day) and that 225 days would be equivalent to one full day per year, the % of days worked per year is calculated as follows:

% of days worked per year=days worked per year/225\*100

Example: A person dedicates 50 days a year to agricultural work on their holding.

% of days worked per year=50/225\*100=22 Therefore, they would select the section "From 0% to <25%"

The Survey on the Structure of Agricultural Holdings is part of statistical operation 30044 of the National Statistical Plan 2021-2024. It is a periodic statistical operation for the collection, preparation and publication of information on the structure of the agricultural sector. The Survey mainly provides data related to the characteristics of the organization and structure of the sector and the use of resources such as land, water, livestock and labour.

Regulation (EU) No. 2018/1091 of the European Parliament and of the Council of the European Union of 18 July 2018 establishes that Member States will carry out a survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in 2023. On the other hand, the second additional provision of Law 13/1996, of 30 December, indicates as mandatory statistics those whose production is mandatory for the Spanish State due to the requirements of European Union regulations.

The confidential data obtained by the statistical services both directly from the informants and through other sources will be subject to protection and will be covered by **statistical secrecy** (art. 13.1 of the Law of the Public Statistical Function (LFEP)). All statistical staff will have the obligation to preserve statistical secrecy (art. 17.1 of the LFEP).

Laws 4/1990 and 13/1996 establish the **obligation to provide data** requested for the compilation of this statistic. To carry out their functions, the statistical services will be empowered to collect data from all natural and legal persons or any other entity resident in Spain or that, not being residents, carry out an economic activity in Spain (art 10.2 of the LFEP). All natural and legal persons, as well as entities that provide data, whether their collaboration is mandatory or voluntary, must answer truthfully, accurately, completely and within the deadline to the questions ordered in due form by the statistical services (art 10.4 of the LFEP).

**Failure to comply** with the obligations established in this Law, in relation to statistics for state purposes, **will be sanctioned** in accordance with the provisions of the regulations contained in this Title (art. 48.1 of the LFEP). Very serious violations will be punished with fines of **3,005.07 to 30,050.61 euros**. Serious violations will be punished with fines of **300.52 to 3,005.06 euros**. Minor infractions will be punished with fines of **60.10 to 300.51 euros** (art. 51.1, 51.2 and 51.3 of the LFEP).
