Legislation

Statistical Secrecy

The personal data obtained by the statistical services will be protected by **statistical secrecy** (art. 13.1 of the Law on Public Statistical Services, dated the 9th of May 1989, LFEP)). All statistical personnel will be obliged to maintain statistical secrecy (art. 17.1 of the LFEP).

Obligation to provide data

Laws 4/1990 and 13/1996 set out the **obligation to provide the data** that is requested for the compilation of this statistic.

Statistical services may request data from individuals and legal entities, both national and foreign, resident in Spain (art. 10.1 of the LFEP).

All individuals and legal entities that provide data **should respond in a true, exact and comprehensive way within the stipulated deadlines** to the questions asked by statistical services (art. 10.2 of the LFEP).
