Environmental Accounts: Environmental Protection Expenditure Account
Preview year 2018


The National Expenditure on Environmental Protection increased by 5.5% in 2018 and represented 1.56% of GDP.

Corporations accounted for 47.3% of the total expenditure, Public Administrations for 35.2% and Households for 17.5%.

## **National Expenditure on Environmental Protection**

The National Expenditure on Environmental Protection (NEEP) grew in 2018, for the fourth year in a row, reaching 18,729 millions of euros.


## National expenditure on environmental protection



Compared with the previous year, the NEEP has increased by 5.5% in 2018, two points higher than the growth of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at market prices that year.

The NEEP represented 1.56% of GDP, three hundredths more than in 2017.

### Annual change in GDP and in National expenditure on environmental protection




## National Expenditure on Environmental Protection by area

The areas with the greatest contribution to the NEEP in 2018 were *Waste management services* (61.7% of total expenditure) and *Wastewater management services* (19.3%).

On the other hand, those that had the lowest contribution were *Biodiversity and Landscape Protection Services* (5.4%) and *Environmental R&D and other activities* (6.5%).

## NEEP by area (percentage). 2018



The greatest increases in expenditure compared to the previous year were in *Wastewater Management Services* (6.9%) and in *Waste Management* and *Biodiversity and Landscape Protection Services* (5.5%).

Regarding the contributions to NEEP growth in 2018, the areas that achieved the highest growth were the *Waste management services* (3.403 points) and the *Wastewater management services* (1.333).

### National Expenditure on Environmental Protection by institutional sector

The *Corporations* sector accounted for 47.3% of total expenditure in 2018. More specifically, this sector spent 8,862 millions of euros, 6.8% more than the previous year.

The expenditure of the *Public Administrations and NPISHs* sector represented 35.2% of the total. It reached 6,588 millions of euros, 4.1% more than in 2017.

On the other hand, *Households* increased their expenditure by 3.9% up to 3,279 million, representing 17.5% of the total .

The *Corporations* sector contributed the most to NEEP growth, with 3.216 points, followed by the *Public Administrations and NPISHs* sector with 1.443 points. On the other hand, the *Households* sector contributed the least (0.683 points).

### National expenditure components by institutional sector

The main national expenditure categories in 2018 were intermediate consumption (40.7% of the total), final consumption (46.8%) and gross fixed capital formation (13.6%).

The *Public Administrations and NPISHs* sector accounted for 62.6% of final consumption expenditure, whilst the *Households* sector accounted for the remaining 37.4%.

On the other hand, the *Corporations* sector generated 51.4% of the gross fixed capital formation, whilst the *Public Administrations and NPISHs* sector generated 48.6%.

## Data review and update

## Methodological note

The objective of the Environmental Accounts (EA) is to integrate the environmental information in a coherent way in the central National Accounts system. They include a set of satellite accounts, which are transmitted annually, compiled using the accounting formats applicable to the different sectoral and territorial areas, with a strong use of physical data. They show the interaction between the economy, households and environmental factors.

The Expenditure on Environmental Protection Account presents data on economic resources dedicated by resident units to Environmental Protection (EP). The account's main objective is to calculate the aggregate National Expenditure on Environmental Protection (NEEP).

This account can be used to construct indicators in key areas, expenditure on the prevention and reduction of contamination, contribution of EP activities to the economy, change to the use of technologies that prevent contamination. In addition, by linking EP expenditure to data in physical terms it is possible to carry out specific analyses, with the amount of treated waste, the expansion of protected areas and the number of patents for products.
