Spanish Tourism Satellite Account. Base 2010 2010-2017 Series

The contribution of tourism reached 137,020 million euros in 2017, representing 11.7% of GDP


Industry branches concerning tourism generated 2.60 million jobs, 12.8% of total employment.

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) contribution associated with tourism, measured through the total tourist demand, reached 137,020 million euros in 2017. This figure represented 11.7% of GDP, 0.4% more than in 2016.

Since 2010, the contribution of tourism to GDP has increased by 1.5 points, from 10.2% to 11.7%.

In turn, employment in industry branches concerning tourism reached 2.60 million jobs. This represented 12.8% of total employment in the economy, 0.1% less than in 2011.

The contribution of jobs connected to tourism has increased by 1.2 points since 2010, from 11.6% to 12.8% of total employment in the economy.



Contribution of tourism to GDP and employment Percentage


Contribution of tourism to GDP




In 2017, the component with the greatest contribution to the total tourist demand was inbound tourist consumption, with 50.0% of the total. This aggregate has shown the greatest growth in recent years within total tourist demand.



Contribution of inbound tourist consumption to total tourist demand Percentage

Total tourist demand increased by 5.6% in 2017. Since 2010, the development of the tourist economy in real terms has been better than that of the economy as a whole.



Methodological note

The Tourism Satellite Account for Spain (TSAS) is a summary statistic comprised of a set of accounts and tables, based on the methodological principles of national accounting and that presents the different economic parameters of tourism in Spain, for a given reference date. The current base is 2010.

It essentially consists of three types of components:

- Supply accounts and tables, in which an attempt is made to characterise the production and cost structures of tourism companies.

- Demand tables, in which an attempt is made to characterise, from an economic viewpoint, the different types of tourists, domestic tourism compared to international tourism, the type of goods and services for which there is demand, etc.

- Tables that interrelate supply and demand, which allow integrated measurements of the contribution of tourism to the economy to be obtained through macro variables such as GDP, production or employment.
