Year 2021

In 2021, 282,210 adults and 13,595 minors were sentenced by final judgment

The most frequent offences were related to road safety (23.7% of the total), theft (17.2%) and injuries (14.0%).

The number of adults convicted of sexual crimes was 3,196 and that of minors 439

Adults convicted by final judgement registered in the Central Register of Convicted Persons¹

In 2021, 282,210 convicted adults (18 years of age and over) were entered in the registry according to the final judgements handed down and communicated to the Central Registry of Prisoners, representing 27.4% more than the previous year.

This increase in the number of convicted persons may have been affected by the atypical situation in 2020, caused by mobility due to the COVID-19 pandemic. If data from 2021 is compared with that of 2019, the number of adult convicts decreased by 1.6%.

In 2021, 80.7% of convicted persons were men and 19.3% were women. The number of men registered increased by 27.8% and that of women by 26.0%.

The rate of convicted persons per 1,000 inhabitants aged 18 and over was 7.2. For men it was 12.0 and for women 2.7.



The average age of convicted persons was 37.8 years (37.9 years for men and 37.7 for women).

Analysing the rates per 1,000 inhabitants of convicted persons by sex and age, the most frequent group 18 to 20 years of age, in the case of both men and women (with rates of 24.6 and 6.5, respectively).

Most of the people convicted in 2021 had Spanish nationality (75.2% as compared with 74.9% the previous year). Nevertheless, considering the rate of convicted persons per 1,000 inhabitants aged 18 years and over, the rate of foreign convicted persons (15.9) was nearly 2.6 times higher than those of Spanish nationality (6.1).

Among foreign nationals, countries from the Americas represented the highest percentage of convicted persons (33.9% of the total).

Out of the total convicted persons, 74.6% were convicted for a single crime and 25.4% for more than one.

Sentences imposed

In 2021, 789,329 sentences were imposed in final judgments issued and registered in the Registry, 33.1% more than in 2020 (and 2.6% more than in 2019).

48.7% of the punishments, both principal and accessory, were *punishments restricting other rights*. 32.6% were *fines* and 18.6% were *custodial penalties*.

Among punishments restricting other rights, the most frequent was special disqualification for employment (14.8% of the total). Among custodial sentences, imprisonment was the most common (17.9%).

By sex of the offender, *punishments restricting other rights* represented 51.2% of the total for men and 34.1% for women. 18.8% of the total sentences imposed on men were *custodial sentences* (18.1% were *imprisonment*). On women, 17.1% were *custodial sentences* (16.4% were *imprisonment*).

By nationality of the offender, *custodial sentences* were more frequent among foreign convicts (19.7% of the total, as compared with 18.2% of Spaniards). In particular, *imprisonment* accounted for 19.2% of the total for foreigners and 17.4% for Spaniards.

During 2021, 141,066 *prison* sentences were imposed, 29.0% more than in 2020 (and 0.9% less than in 2019). Of these, 92.8% had a duration of zero to two years, 6.0% from two to five years and 1.2% more than five years.


34.0% of imprisonment sentences were for crimes relating to property and the socio-economic order, 18.2% for crimes relating to collective security and 11.3% for crimes involving injuries.

Registered crimes and their typology

In 2021, 410,842 crimes were registered, 32.0% more than in the previous year (and 0.4% less than in 2019).

According to their typology, those with the greatest incidence were *crimes against road safety* (23.7% of the total), crimes relating to *injuries* (17.2%) and *theft* (14.0%).

The average number of crimes per convicted person was 1.5. By sex, the average was higher for men (1.5) than for women (1.3).

Of the total number of crimes committed, 90.7% were in the degree of consummation and 8.8% in the degree of attempt.

Convicted persons and offences by place of conviction

Andalucia was the autonomous community where the most convicted persons were registered (19.6% of the total). It was followed by Cataluña (15.8%) and Comunidad de Madrid (12.4%).

Cataluña was the Autonomous Community with more foreign convicted persons (24.2% of the total), followed by Comunidad de Madrid (15.7%) and Comunitat Valenciana (13.1%).

The autonomous cities of Ceuta and Melilla registered the highest rates of registered convicts per 1,000 inhabitants (14.1 and 12.2, respectively). In turn, Castilla-La Mancha (7.7) and Castilla y León (5.8) recorded the lowest figures.

In Spain as a whole, the crime rate per 1,000 inhabitants (according to the place of conviction) was 10.5 in 2021.


The Autonomous Cities of Ceuta (18.7) and Melilla (18.5), and Illes Balears (12.7) registered the highest rates per 1,000 inhabitants.

In turn, Castilla-La Mancha (7.9), Castilla y León (8.6), and Comunidad Foral de Navarra (8.8) recorded the lowest figures.

Minors convicted by final judgement registered in the Central Register for Criminal Responsibility of Minors²

In 2021, a total of 13,595 convicted minors (aged 14 to 17 years old) were registered according to final judgements communicated to the registry, indicating an increase of 21.0%, as compared with the previous year (and 3.7% less than in 2019).

81.0% of convicted minors were men and 19.0% were women.

The rate for convicted minors aged 14 to 17 years old per 1,000 inhabitants in the same age bracket was 6.8.


By age, the 17-year-old group was the most numerous (30.7% of total convicted persons), followed by the 16-year-old group (28.8%).

Analysing the rates by sex and age of convicted minors, the highest were 17 years for men (13.9) and 16 for women (2.9 in both).

The majority of convicted minors had Spanish nationality (79.4%). Nevertheless, the rate of convicted minors per 1,000 inhabitants aged 14 to 17 was almost three times higher for foreign minors (15.3) than for Spanish minors (5.9).

In terms of the number of offences committed, three out of every five convicted minors (60.8%) carried out just one criminal offence and two in three five out more than one (39.2%).

Measures Taken

Judges adopted 22,064 measures in 2021, for an increase of 20.1% over the previous year (and a 4.9% decline compared to 2019).

The most frequent measures were *probation* (45.1% of the total), *socio-educational tasks* (16.5%) and *internment in semi-open regime* (9.9%).

According to the nationality of the offender, semi-open internment and probation measures fell more frequently on foreign minors (13.8% and 49.5% of the total, respectively) than on Spanish minors (8.8% and 43.8%).

In turn, foreign minors incurred less frequently in measures of *performing socio-educational tasks* and *community services* and *prohibition of approaching or communicating with the victim* (11.5% and 5.0% of the total, respectively, as compared to 18.0% and 8.1% for Spaniards).


Criminal offences and their typology

In 2021, 26,349 crimes committed by minors were registered, 29.4% more than in the previous year (and 1.2% more than in 2019). All of them were crimes.

By type of crime, the highest incidence were *injuries* (33.8% of the total), *robberies* (18.2%) and *threats* (8.2%).

By sex, male minors committed 82.0% of criminal offences and females committed 18.0%.

By age, it can be observed that the number of offences committed increases with age. Therefore, those carried out at the age of 17 (31.5% of the total) accounted for twice those carried out at the age of 14 (15.6%).

78.1% of the offences were committed by Spanish minors and 21.9% by foreign minors, figures similar to those of the previous year.

Convicted minors and criminal offences by place of sentence

Andalusia was the community with the most convicted minors recorded in the Registry, with 19.1% of the total. It was followed by Comunitat Valenciana (13.6%) and Cataluña (12.2%).

This order was different in the case of minors of Spanish and foreign nationality. In the case of Spaniards, Andalucia was the community with the highest number of convicted minors (21.3% of the total), followed by Comunitat Valenciana (14.0%) and Comunidad de Madrid (10.9%). However, Cataluña was the Autonomous Community with the most convicted persons who were minors (19.6% of the total), followed by Comunidad de Madrid (14.8%) and Comunitat Valenciana (11.9%).

The autonomous cities of Ceuta and Melilla (with 41.6 and 27.0, respectively) and Illes Balears (with 10.1), registered the highest rates of minors aged 14-17 years convicted per 1,000 inhabitants in the same age group.

On the other hand, Galicia (4.6) and Comunidad de Madrid (5.6) presented the lowest values.

In Spain, the rate of criminal offences committed per 1,000 inhabitants aged between 14 and 17 (by place of sentence) was 13.2 in 2021.


The Autonomous Cities of Melilla y Ceuta (with 96.2 and 87.3, respectively) and Illes Balears (21.7) registered the highest rates per 1,000 inhabitants.

On the other hand, Galicia (9.2), Región de Murcia (9.5) and Comunidad de Madrid (9.9) presented the lowest values.

Convicted persons registered in the Central Register of Sex Offenders³

In 2021, 3,196 adults were convicted of sexual crimes⁴, which was 34.6% more than the previous year (and 18.0% more than in 2019). 97.9% were men and 2.1% were women.

These convicts committed 3,960 crimes, 35.5% more than in 2020 (and 16.4% more than in 2019). Of the total, 1,556 were considered sexual abuse, 738 as sexual abuse and assault of minors under 16 years of age and 592 prostitution and corruption of minors. Of the 491 sexual assaults, 46 were considered rape.

In 2021, 439 minors were convicted of sexual crimes, 12.6% more than the previous year (and 5.5% more than in 2019). 96.8% were men and 3.2% were women.

These minor convicts committed 609 crimes, 27.7% more than in 2020 (and 11.1% more than in 2019). Of the total of these crimes, 291 were considered sexual abuse and assault on minors under 16, 176 sexual abuse and 66 prostitution and corruption of minors. Of the 55 sexual assaults, seven were considered rape.

Data Review and Update

The data published today is final and is not subject to further revision. All results are available on INEBase.

Methodological note

Conviction Statistics: Adults and Conviction Statistics: Minors, are prepared under the Collaboration Agreement signed between the Ministry of Justice and the National Institute of Statistics (INE) on July 3, 2007, updated and renewed on November 21, 2017.

The aim of both statistics is to provide detailed information on convicted adults, using confirmed sentencing, crimes committed and sentences imposed at the national, regional and provincial levels broken down by sex, age and nationality; as well as on convicted minors, criminal offences committed and measures imposed, also at the national, regional and provincial levels and broken down by sex, age and nationality.

The Penal Code reform in July 2015, in the case of adults, eliminated misdemeanours, turning them into minor crimes, meaning that the increase in the number of convicted persons and in the number of penalties is due in part to the inclusion of these new crimes. This fact shall be taken into account when interpreting temporal variations in the data.

In addition, as of 2017, more detailed information on sexual offences has been provided for both adults and minors.

Type of operation: annual continuous statistical operation.

Population scope: all persons aged 18 years and over, or 14 to 17 years, convicted by final judgement and registered, respectively, in the Central Register of Convicted Persons, in the Central Register for Criminal Responsibility of Minors and in the Central Register of Sex Offenders, during the reference period.

Geographical scope: the entire national territory.

Reference period for the results: the calendar year.

Reference period of the information: date of entry in the Register.

Collection method: statistical use of an administrative register.
