Elections to the Spanish Parliament on 23 July 2023

A total of 37,466,432 voters will be eligible to vote in the elections to the Spanish Parliament

Voters residing abroad may vote without the need for a prior request

The electoral roll can be consulted from 5 to 12 June

On July 23, 2023, 37,466,432 voters will be eligible to vote in the elections to the Spanish Parliament. Of them, 35,141,122 reside in Spain and 2,325,310 abroad.

Of the voters living in Spain, 1,639,179 will be able to participate in a general election for the first time, due to having turned 18 since the last Spanish parliamentary election, held on November 10, 2019.

Vote of electors residing abroad

Voters residing abroad may vote in the Spanish Parliament elections without the need for a prior request. The Electoral Census Office (ECO) will send all voters the necessary documentation for voting in two separate mailings, which can also be obtained directly from the voting centres established by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, European Union and Cooperation from 15 to 20 July, which are the days authorised for depositing the vote in the ballot box. Electoral roll consultation and claims

The electoral census of residents in Spain can be consulted from the 5 to 12 of June in the city councils and provincial delegations of the ECO. Voters living abroad will be able to check their registration details at consular offices on these same dates.

Also available at the INE Electronic Headquarters (<u>https://sede.ine.gob.es</u>) is a service for consulting the registration data in the electoral census after accreditation of the voter's identity with the Cl@ve system (electronic DNI, among others) and in the case of voters living in Spain, it also shows the polling station and address of the polling station.

Voters may present claims on their registration data in the city councils, consulates or in the provincial delegations of the ECO, within the same period, from 5 to 12 June. Voters living in Spain may also submit claims through the INE Electronic Office with the Cl@ve system and providing a valid certificate of registration in the Municipal Register of their residence.

Requests to object to receiving electoral propaganda

Those who make this request until 12 June will not receive electoral propaganda from political parties in the electoral campaign of these elections, in accordance with the provisions of the legislative change carried out in December 2018. Requests received later than 12 June will take effect in the following elections.

The request for exclusion can be made online, with the Cl@ve system, at the INE Electronic Headquarters or in the town halls, consular offices and provincial delegations of the ECO.

Delivery of copies of the electoral roll to the representatives of the proclaimed candidacies

In these elections, the procedure for delivering copies of the electoral roll to the representatives of the proclaimed candidacies who request them will be by downloading them from an INE portal. As a requirement, when requesting the copies, two email accounts must be provided that will be used to send the portal candidature information and passwords for accessing the files and opening them.

Polling cards

The polling cards will be sent out as of 26 June, indicating the local polling station where the voter will vote.

Information

On the INE website (<u>http://www.ine.es</u>), relevant information is available on the actions of the ECO in these elections, count of voters, claims, polling stations and electoral premises, postal voting, deadlines and legal regulations.

In addition to the consultation of the current electoral roll, the following procedures are offered at the Electronic Headquarters of the INE, without the need for accreditation with electronic certificate:

- General consultation of local polling stations without the need for accreditation
- Status query of the postal vote and registered mail number, if sent to Correos (Post Office)
- Completion of the vote-by-mail application

In addition, the provincial delegations of the ECO deal with consultations on actions within their competence (registration in the census, polling stations and voting places, census cards, postal voting, etc.) at their offices and via the telephone number 900.343.232.
