### Elections to Spanish Parliament of 10 November de 2019

# In the elections to the Spanish Parliament, 37,000,608 electors will be able to vote

Voters residing abroad who wish to vote must apply by 19 October

# The electoral census can be consulted from 30 September to 7 October

On 10 November 2019, 37,000,608 voters may vote in the elections to the Spanish Parliament. Of these, 34,872,049 of them live in Spain, and 2,128,559 live abroad.

Of the voters living in Spain, 226,771 will be able to participate in general elections for the first time, due to having turned 18 since the previous election to the Spanish Parliament, held on 28 April 2019.

#### Application for a vote by electors residing abroad

Voters residing abroad who applied to vote in the elections to the Spanish Parliament on 28 April 2019 and whose petition was accepted by the Electoral Census Office (ECO) should not reapply.

The ECO is sending these voters an information letter in which it specifies these terms and communicates that their vote application is still considered valid.

On the other hand, voters who did not request to vote in the elections on 28 April and who wish to vote in the elections on 10 November must apply by 19 October to the provincial delegation of the ECO corresponding to their registration. The ECO is sending the official application form to these voters.

Applications can be submitted on-line. To do so, it is necessary to have an electronic certificate recognised by the National Statistics Institute (INE) Electronic Office or to use the password sent with the official form.

From 24 March the form is also available at the consulates and on the web pages of the Ministry of the Interior, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, European Union and Cooperation and the INE.

#### Consultation of the electoral census and claims

The electoral census in force for these elections is the one closed as at 1 July 2019, which contains the variations produced in the registers of origin (city councils or consulates) until 27 June.

The electoral census of residents in Spain can be consulted from 30 September to 7 October in the city councils and provincial delegations of the ECO. Voters resident abroad will be able to check their registration details at consular offices on these same dates.

Voters may present claims on their registration data in the city councils, consulates or in the provincial delegations of the ECO, within the same period, from 30 September to 7 October.

A consultation service is also available at the INE Electronic Office (<a href="https://sede.ine.gob.es">https://sede.ine.gob.es</a>) to consult the registration data in the electoral census, which also contains the polling station

table and address of the electoral centre, upon accreditation of the identity of the voter with a recognised electronic certificate.

#### Exclusion to receive electoral propaganda

Voters may request the exclusion of the copies of the electoral census that are given to the representatives of the candidatures for the sending of electoral propaganda. These exclusions are continuous and have permanent effect unless the voter expresses otherwise.

Those who make this request until 7 October will not receive electoral propaganda from the political parties in the electoral campaign of these elections. Requests after 7 October will take effect at the next election.

The request for exclusion can be carried out by internet, with electronic certificate, at the INE Electronic Office (<a href="https://sede.ine.gob.es/oposicionPartidos">https://sede.ine.gob.es/oposicionPartidos</a>) or at the city councils, consular offices and provincial delegations of the ECO by submitting a standard form.

#### Census cards

From 17 April the ECO will send each voter residing in Spain a census card with the polling station and the electoral premises where they are entitled to vote.

#### Information

On the INE website (<a href="http://www.ine.es">http://www.ine.es</a>), relevant information is available on the actions of the ECO in these elections, count of voters, claims, polling stations and electoral premises, postal voting, deadlines and legal regulations.

In addition to the consultation of the current electoral roll, the following procedures are offered at the Electronic Headquarters of the INE, without the need for accreditation with electronic certificate:

- General consultation of polling stations and electoral premises
- Consultation of the status of the postal vote and certified sending number, if it was sent through the Post Office
- Filling out the application for postal voting

In addition, the provincial delegations of the ECO deal with consultations on actions within their competence (registration in the census, polling stations and voting places, census cards, postal voting, etc.) at their offices and via the telephone number +34 901 101 900.
