Registered Health Professionals Statistics Year 2021

The number of registered doctors increased by 2.8%, and that of registered nurses by 1.8%

The rate of registered doctors stood at 5.99 per 1,000 inhabitants and the rate of nurses was 6.98

The number of registered health care professionals in Spain was $923,207^1$ in 2021, $2.8\%^2$ more than the previous year. By sex, 289,266 were men (a 2.0% increase) and 633,941 were women (a 3.2% increase).

The majority were *nurses* (35.83% of the total), followed by *doctors* (30.74%) and *pharmacists* (8.46%). On the other hand, the groups with the least representation were *physicists* and *chemists* with a health specialty (0.03% both) and *biologists* with a health specialty (0.07%).

²The variation rate has been calculated by subtracting the data on Nutritionist Dieticians in 2020, since the data for 2021 is not available.

The number of registered *doctors* in Spain increased by 7,619 people (2.8%) reaching a total of 283,811 in 2021.

On the other hand, registered *nurses* increased by 5,727 people (1.8%), standing at 330,745. Within this group, 9,834 people were registered as *midwives*³ (2.5% more than in 2020).

The number of registered professionals in the other health professions covered by the statistics also increased, except for the number of *chemists* with a speciality in health (-1.0%). The largest increases were registered in *biologists with a health specialty* (16.6%), *occupational therapists* (15.5%) and *chiropodists* (9.9%).

Rates of registered health professionals

The number of registered health professionals per 1,000 inhabitants differs according to the group. In 2021, the number of *nurses* presented the highest rate (6.98 per 1,000 inhabitants), followed by *doctors* (5.99) and *pharmacists* (1.65).


In turn, the lowest rates were observed in the groups of *occupational therapists* (0.14) *and dental technicians* (0.16).

In the case of nurses specializing in *midwifery*, the rate was 0.95 per 1,000 women of childbearing age.



Rates per 1,000 inhabitants



The rates per 1,000 inhabitants increased in 2021 in all health professionals. The greatest increases occurred in those of *doctors* (0.16 points), *nurses* (0.12) and physiotherapists and *psychologists with a health specialty* (0.06 in both).



Registered nurses and doctors 2017-2021 Series.


Rates per 1,000 inhabitants

Registered health professionals by sex, age and employment status

The health profession is predominantly female. In 2021, there were more women than men in 13 of the 15 professions analysed. The groups with the highest percentage of women in 2017 were *speech therapists* (93.5% were women), *occupational therapists* (90.4%) and *nurses*(84.2%).

On the other hand, the professions with the lowest percentage of women in were *dental technicians* (30.4%), *physicists* with a speciality in health (33.2%) and *veterinarians* (52.0%).

By age group, the highest percentages of health professionals under 45 years of age were found in *occupational therapists* (91.1%), *physiotherapists* (81.0%) and *podiatrists* (72.9%).

On the other hand, the lowest percentages in this age group occurred in the groups of *medical doctors* (38.4%), *biologists with a health specialty* (39.7%) and *dental technicians* (40.1%).



According to employment situation, the lowest percentages of non-retired registered professionals were *medical doctors* (83.3%), *nurses* (89.1%) and *pharmacists* (93.1%). And the largest in *chemists with a health specialty* (100%), *occupational therapists* (99.9%) and *psychologists with a health specialty* (99.2%).

Data by Autonomous Communities and Cities

The number of registered *doctors* increased in all the autonomous communities in 2021, and only decreased in the autonomous city of Melilla (-0.6%).

The greatest increases occurred in Illes Balears (3.8%), Andalucía and Canarias (3.6%) in both). And the minors in the autonomous city of Ceuta (0.6%), Castilla y León (1.2%) and Aragón (1.7%).



The highest rates of *registered doctors* were in Aragon (7.25 per 1,000 inhabitants), Comunidad de Madrid (7.13) and Principado de Asturias (7.00). And the lowest in the autonomous cities of Melilla (3.93) and Ceuta (4.26) and in Castilla-La Mancha (4.71).

The number of *nurses* increased in 14 of the 19 regions, and decreased in the rest. The greatest increases were recorded in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (7.5%), automous city of Ceuta (7.0%) and Canarias (4.5%). And the greatest decreases in Galicia (-2.3%), the autonomous city of Melilla (-1.2%) and La Rioja (-0.8%).

Nurses by Autonomous Communities and Cities 2017-2021 Series.



The highest rates of registered *nurses* per 1,000 inhabitants were recorded in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (11.15), Cantabria (8.82) and Extremadura (8.13). The lowest were in Región de Murcia (4.63), Galicia (5.21) and Illes Balears (5.73).

As for the other professions, the highest ratios of registered *pharmacists* per 1,000 inhabitants were in Comunidad Foral de Navarra (2.35), Galicia (2.03) and Comunidad de Madrid (2.02). In turn, the lowest rates were recorded in the Autonomous Cities of Ceuta (1.09) and Melilla (1.12), and in Illes Baleares (1.17).

The highest rates of *physiotherapists* were found in Comunidad de Madrid (1.76 per 1,000 inhabitants), Cantabria (1.50) and Principado de Asturias (1.54). The lowest figures were registered in the Autonomous Cities of Melilla (0.59 years) and Ceuta (0.77) and in Andalucía (1.03).

Comunidad de Madrid (1.33), Principado de Asturias (0.92) and País Vasco (0.91) had the highest rates of *licensed dentists*. Castilla-La Mancha (0.46) and the autonomous cities of Melilla (0.47) and Ceuta (0.50) presented the lowest.

The highest rates of *psychologists* specialising in health care were 1.79 per 1,000 inhabitants in Comunidad de Madrid, 1.20 in the Autonomous City of Melilla and 0.97 in Región de Murcia and La Rioja. For its part, the lowest rates were 0.25 in Castilla-La Mancha, 0.38 in the Autonomous City of Ceuta and 0.53 in Comunitat Valenciana.

Región de Murcia presented the highest rate of registered *optician-optometrists* (0.53) followed by Comunidad de Madrid and Comunitat Valenciana (0.49 in both). The lowest rates were registered in the autonomous cities of Melilla (0.23) and Ceuta (0.24) and in Illes Balears (81.9) and Canarias (0.26 in both).

The Communities with the highest rates of registered *speech therapists*⁴ were Region de Murcia (0.46), Cataluña (0.38) and Cantabria (0.34). Canarias had the lowest rate (0.01) followed by Aragón (0.13) and Illes Balears (0.17).

Podiatrists recorded the highest rates in Extremadura (0.39), Comunidad Valenciana (0.25) and Andalucia (0.22). This group registered the lowest rates in the Canarias (0.06) and in the autonomous cities of Melilla (0.07) and Ceuta (0.08).

The Autonomous Communities with the highest rates of registered *dental technicians*⁵ were Cantabria (0.27 per every 1,000 inhabitants), Comunitat Valenciana (0.25) and Aragón (0.21). Meanwhile, those that presented the lowest rates were La Rioja and Castilla-La Mancha (0.09 in both) and Extremadura and Canarias (0.12 for both).

Finally, the highest rates of registered *occupational therapists*⁶ were in Extremadura (0.67), Aragón (0.47) and Comunidad Foral de Navarra (0.34). And the lowest in Andalusia (0.02) and the Canarias (0.04).

Data Review and Update

The data published today is final and is not subject to further revision. All results are available on INEBase.

⁴ There is no data for Principado de Asturias and Comunidad Foral de Navarra since there is no Official College for *speech therapists* in these Autonomous Communities. Data for Ceuta and Melilla are included in Andalucía.

⁵ No data is collected from País Vasco as no Official College of *Dental Technicians* has been established there.

⁶ There is no data for Cantabria, Cantabria and the Autonomous Cities of Ceuta and Melilla because there is no Official College of *Occupational Therapists* in these Autonomous Communities.

Methodological note

The Registered Health Professionals Statistics is am annual structural statistic that investigates the number and characteristics of health professionals registered in their respective Professional Colleges or Councils. It has been compiled at the National Statistics Institute without interruption since 1952. This research provides information to various international organisations such as the OECD and the Statistical Office of the European Union (Eurostat).

The information currently provided refers to the professions included in Law 44/2003 of 21 November on the Regulation of Health Professions, or which meet the requirements established therein. The groups are: *doctors, pharmacists, dentists, veterinarians, psychologists with a speciality in health, physicians with a speciality in health, nurses, physiotherapists, podiatrists, opticians-optometrists, dental technicians, chemists with a speciality in health, occupational therapists, speech therapists and biologists with a speciality in health.*

The questionnaires are completed through a web application (IRIA) by the General Councils and/or Professional Colleges.

Type of operation: annual continuous statistics.

Population scope: professionals in the health care field that are registered in any Spanish College

Geographical scope: the entire national territory.

Reference period: the data refer to 31 December

Collection method: online questionnaire (web application).
