## University Entrance Exams. Year 2008

## In 2008, a total of 218,150 students register, of whom 56.9\% are women

## 82.4\% of the registered students pass, 1.8 points more than the previous year

During the year 2008, a total of 218,150 students registered to sit the University Entrance Exams.

154,952 students registered for the June exam session, and $89.5 \%$ of them passed the exams, while 42,804 students registered for the September exam session, and $68.6 \%$ of them passed.

On the other hand, in the entrance exams for persons over 25 years of age, 21,997 students registered, that is, $7.9 \%$ less than the previous year. $57.8 \%$ of them passed the exams, $18 \%$ more than in 2007.

## A higher percentage of women than men pass

$56.9 \%$ of the persons who hoped to start University were women, and $83.4 \%$ of those women who sat the exams passed. The percentage of men who passed was $81.0 \%$.

## Social Sciences is the option preferred by the students

Excluding the exams for persons over 25 years of age, the Social Sciences option was the option preferred by the registered students (with $32.8 \%$ ), followed by the Health Sciences option (25.8\%) and the Technical-Scientific option (22.2\%).

The two options that carried the least weight among the students were the Combined options (students who registered for more than one option), with $5.1 \%$ of the registered students, and the Arts option, with $2.4 \%$ of the students.

## Options chosen



Technical-Scientific is the option most chosen by men, and Social Sciences is the option that most chosen by women

Considering distribution by sex, $36.1 \%$ of the women chose the Social Sciences option as compared with the $3.0 \%$ who chose Arts. In turn, $36.8 \%$ of the men preferred the TechnicalScientific option as compared with the $1.7 \%$ who chose Arts.
