2030 Agenda Indicators for Sustainable Development


The INE publishes 367 data series on 144 SDG indicators

The electronic platform for the 2030 Agenda indicators offers new visualization tools

The INE has completed the publication of 367 data series or sub-indicators corresponding to 144 indicators of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development on the electronic platform created for this purpose on its website. Considering in addition the five indicators that are not applicable for our country, a coverage rate of 60% has been achieved on the total of indicators of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the global framework.

Of the 17 Goals, 12 have coverage equal to or greater than 50%. Among them, SDG 15 stands out (*Protect, restore and promote the sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, halt and reverse land degradation and halt the loss of biodiversity),* with coverage of 86%. In contrast, Goal 14 (*Conserve and sustainably use oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development*) has the lowest coverage, with 10% of the indicators available.

The goals of the 2030 Agenda are usually grouped into five areas: People (SDG 1-5), Planet (SDG 6, 12, 13, 14 and 15), Prosperity (SDG 7-11), Peace (SDG 16) and Partnership (SDG 17). Considering this grouping, the INE has published 168 series relating to 54 indicators related to People, which represents a coverage rate of 66%.

In the area of Planet, there are 62 data series on 26 indicators, with which the coverage rate stands at 46%. Regarding Prosperity, 77 series of 38 indicators can be consulted (coverage rate 62%). For Peace, 43 series of 13 indicators have been published (coverage rate 54%). Finally, for the monitoring of the Partnership, the list of series amounts to 17 corresponding to 13 indicators, which also represents a coverage rate of 54%.

Since its launch in 2018, the INE has progressively incorporated new indicators from the United Nations global framework and from the list of the European Statistical System to the electronic platform to facilitate the monitoring of the SDGs in our country.

The Indicators of the 2030 Agenda cover the economic, social, environmental and institutional spheres, therefore, in their preparation, in addition to the INE, 16 ministerial departments and the Bank of Spain participate.

The statistical information comes from 40 operations of the National Statistical Plan and the dissemination of data occurs continuously on the platform of the SDG indicators, as the results of the statistics that are used as a source for their calculation become available.


Visualization tools improvement

The electronic platform of the indicators of the 2030 Agenda, accessible through the INE website, incorporates as of today several new visualization elements, which include maps and graphs of time evolution, by age and sex for social indicators, or by sector for those of an economic nature, provided that sufficient information is available and depending on the characteristics of the indicator.

In accordance with the slogan of the 2030 Agenda of "leaving no one behind", the information is presented broken down by various variables depending on the characteristics of each indicator, the United Nations metadata and the information available.


In the indicators pertaining to the field of *People* in general, graphs are offered by age groups and sex. Thus, the sub-indicator 1.2.1.1 *Population at risk of relative poverty (income below 60% of median income)* presents data by age group. The highest percentages of relative risk of poverty are observed in the groups under 16 years of age (27.1%) and between 16 and 29 years of age (26.5%). On the other hand, the lowest figures are registered in the group aged 65 and over (14.5%).

In the area related to the *Planet* numerous indicators of environmental statistics are offered, disaggregated by different categories such as the types of treatment of the *sub-indicator* 12.4.2.1 Hazardous waste generated per capita and proportion of hazardous waste treated, broken down by type of treatment. In 2018, the proportion of hazardous waste dumped was 22.5%, that of recycled hazardous waste was 70.6% and that of incinerated was 6.9%.

Information disaggregated by sex can also be consulted on the electronic platform, such as Indicator 16.1.3. *Proportion of the population that has suffered a) physical violence, b) psychological violence and c) sexual violence in the last 12 months corresponding to the area of Peace.* The figures for this indicator stand at 0.54% for the total population, 0.63% for women, and 0.47% for men.



The Resolution of the 2030 Agenda also requires the territorial breakdown of the indicators, so maps and tables are published by autonomous community, when there is enough information.


In the area of *Prosperity*, there are sub-indicators such as 8.5.1.1 *Average hourly income of male and female employees, broken down by occupation, age and persons with disabilities,* which offers data by sex, age groups, disability status and by autonomous community.

For their part, the more economic indicators show the information disaggregated by sector, as well as territorially when the statistical operation allows it. In this way, sub-indicator 9.5.1.1 Research and development expenditures as a proportion of GDP breaks down total spending in 2019 (1.25%) among execution sectors: Public Administration (0.21%), Higher Education (0.33%) and Companies (0.71%).

Sub-indicator 9.5.1.1 Research and development expenditures as a proportion of GDP by Implementing Sectors 2019. Percentage




The graphs of temporal evolution include data from 2015 as it is the year of adoption of the 2030 Agenda, although many of them offer information as of 2008, to facilitate the analysis of the trend of the indicators in order to meet the goal and corresponding target.

Sub-indicator 17.3.1.1 - Foreign direct investment transactions of Spain abroad, official assistance for development and South-South cooperation in the Partnership field presents the evolution since 2013 for the monitoring of Target 17.3. Mobilize additional financial resources from multiple sources for developing countries.

In 2013 this indicator was at 10 million euros. In 2015 it amounted to 20,400 million. In 2017 it reached a minimum of 5,000 million, and in 2019 it stood at 11,900 million.

The data for all charts are available for viewing, downloading and reuse. Additionally, tables with more detailed results are disseminated so that each user can build their own table or consult other information.

In this new edition, the graphs with broken down information are offered for the indicators prepared by the INE. The same type of information will soon be incorporated for the SDG indicators obtained from statistical operations produced by the statistical services of the ministerial departments and the Bank of Spain.

Methodological note

Indicators of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development is a statistical synthesis operation whose objective is to constitute a framework of statistical indicators that serves to monitor the Goals and Goals of the 2030 Agenda in Spain.

The Indicators of the 2030 Agenda cover the economic, social, environmental and institutional spheres, therefore, in their preparation, in addition to the INE, 16 ministerial departments and the Bank of Spain participate. The statistical information comes from 40 operations of the National Statistical Plan.

Reference date of the results

The dissemination of the indicators is carried out continuously on the national platform of the SDGs: https://www.ine.es/dyngs/ODS/es/index.htm

Type of operation: Preparation of syntheses and analyses with results from various sources

Population scope: National territory.

Geographical scope: national, Autonomous Communities and Cities and provinces.

Reference period of the results: that of the statistic from which the indicator is obtained.

Disaggregation variables: depends on the statistics from which the indicator is obtained.

Frequency of dissemination: continuous since 2018.
